Special text books had to be written for the Catholic schools, but in compiling the curriculum the endeavor was made to bring them as far as possible into har-mony with those in use in the public schools, both as regards the division of classes and the courses of studies.

"In endeavoring to conform the Cath-olic program," says Mgr. Satolli, "with that of the government, the fact was not lost sight of that, although the state may theoretically and in the abstract be described as the representative of the peo-ple, it is practically dominated by a party and favors the system of education which is advocated by the party in power rather than that which is best adapted to the needs of the people. Even in connection with the method of teaching—in which the Catholic schools differ greatly from the public schools—the pontifical commission was at pains to conform to the requirenents of the state."

The number of pupils in the elementary Catholic schools exceeds that in the munic-pal schools, and if the number in the Catholic high schools is a trifle smaller than that in the corresponding state schools this is because it is much easier for the young men who attend the state schools to obtain diplomas, as the exam-iners for diplomas are the teachers in the state schools. In spite of the humiliation and opposition to which Catholics are subjected the parents have not lost confidence in the Catholic schools, and the results

are more than satisfactory.

Taking into account the contributions made for the purpose of Catholic education in Rome from all quarters, the ex-penses for primary Catholic education in Rome would reach a total of at least one and a quarter million lire yearly. This amount comes from direct donations of the buly father, from the estates of the holy see, from donations of certain corporations, churches, congregations and indiciduals, and from the fees of certain insti-

tutions,

South Carelina's Legislature Petitioned to Inventigate.

DR. POPE'S SENSATIONAL CLAIMS.

The Defeated Independent Candidate for Governor Declares That Francis at the Folls Were Committed by the Community 61 Governor Tillman and Senator Irby.

Continues S.C., Nov. 28.—In a patition to the metoral resembly asking for a convestigation of the recent election which Dr., Sampson Pope, the defeated Lie pendent candidate for governor of South Carolina, filled yesterday, charges are undetated United States Senator Irby and Governor Tillman instigated frauds to seemy the election of John Governor. the election of John Gary Evans, the Till-man candidate.

The petition asserts that the recent state election was Hegal, as it was held under the election law of 1892, the provisions of which are declared to be indirect violation of the state and United States constitu tions. It is alieged that the polling places were barricaded and obstructed so that thousands of Pape voters were prevented from voting; that managers unlawfully rejected many Pope votes; that managers fraudulently abstracted Pope votes from the boxes and substituted Evans ballots. and that supervisors of elections gave out thousands of illegal registration tickets to

The petition declares: "These frauds, intimidations and acts of violence com ted by supervisors and managers and par tisans of John Gary Evans were commit-ted in very many cases at the immediate instance of county chairmen of the Demo cratic party, who in turn received their in structions and orders for such action from John L. M. Irby, chairman of the Demo-cratic executive committee and United States senator, and from Benjamin R. Tiliman, governor of the state of South Carolina, whose sworn duty it was to see that have be faithfully executed, but who so far from doing so in some instances in-atructed said county chairmen to call to their aid in executing these frauds, acts of

Intimidation and violence sheriffs, con-stables and armed forces of the state if nec-essary for their accomplishment."

Request is made that this contest of election of governor be determined by legal procedure. Accompanying this peti-tion was a concurrent resolution that Dr. Pope be heard before each body of the general assembly; that he have witnesses summoned to prove his allegations, and that pending the contest returns for governor shall not be opened and tabulated
