The Berlin royal pawnshop pays 19 ps cent on Its capital, and gives the surplu every year to charitable purposes. At Dresden the interest is 9 per cent, p

SOURCE OF THE MISSOURI.

Six Considerable Eivers Joined Together Form Its Actual Bend.

The actual head of the Missouri river, or The actual head of the Missouri river, or what should be known as such had it been intelligently named, is De Lacy's or Sho-shone lake, in the National park. This lake, a considerable body of water, is the source of the Madison river and forms with the river the drainage outlot for most of the waters of that portion of the Na-tional park. The Gallatin, or left source of the Missouri, is formed by two streams, the East and West Gallatin, which units about a mile above its junction with the about a mile above its junction with the Missouri. The Madison and Gailatin are both somewhat smaller than the Jefferson. Had Lewis and Clark ascended the Mad-son instead of the Jefferson, which, being the larger stream, they naturally mis-took for the continuation of the Missouri, they would have discovered the famous gaysers in Firchole basin, Shokhons take and all the country which is now incorpornted within the limits of the National park. The Big Role and the Beaverhead rivers flow into the Jefferson at Twin Bridges, a few miles from the confluence of the Jefferson with the Missouri, so that in reality there are six considerable rivers. all joining one another within a radius of a few miles, which units to form the iongest river in the world, measured from the gulf to the Rocky mountains.-Beachann Uhroniele.


