SPANIER GOVERNMENT WARNED.

Unless That Country Recodes from its Position in Fixing the Maximum Ente on Our Products the President May Take Radical Action by Way of Retaliation.

Washinerton, Dec. is.—The action of the state department in warning the Span-ish government of its intention to retal-late should Spain continue its present polley with respect to American experts to Cuba will doubtless have the effect to bring at once to a focus the long drawn out negotiations which have been in progress, with results very unsatisfactory to our government. For several years this government has been urging the claims of American experters for restitution of heavy fines and excessive tariff taxes, amounting to about \$5,900,000. These taxes and fines were imposed by the Cuban taxes and fines were imposed by the Cuban customs officers in direct violation of all treaties, and absolutely without any other

treaties, and absolutely without any other warrant than existing necessity for funds. The Spanish government practically admitted the justice of our claims, but has failed to make restitution.

This act, while primarily intended to provide for the inspection of meats for expertation and prevent the importation of harmful articles of food, included in its fifth section a grant of power to the presififth section a grant of power to the presi-dent unequalled in extent by any legislation in the history of congress. Plainly stated, it authorizes an actual embargo to be declared at the discretion of the presi-

dent.

Here are the terms of this remarkable section: "That whenever the president shall be satisfied that unjust discrimina-tions are being made by or under the autions are being made by or under the au-thority of any foreign state against the importation or sale in such foreign state of any product of the United States, he may direct that such products of such for-eign state, so discriminating against any product of the United States, as he may deem proper, shall be excluded from importation to the United States. The president may at any time revoke, modify, terminate or renew any such direction as, in his opinion, the public interests may require."

The secretary of state has refrained from the assertion of the power of retaliation conferred by this law as long as there was concerns of this live as long as there was reasonable expectation that the Spanish government would yield to the ordinary methods of diplomacy.
