





It is no cause of surprise here that Ger-many, too, will refrain from joining in an intervention which would be surely disfasteful to Japan, for the latest reports from our cousuls in the latter country how that the German traders are making extraordinary progress in supplanting all other foreigners, even Americans, in so suring control of the valuable Japaness foreign trade.


