

Surrender of the Chinese Vessels

JAPS' NAVAL VICTORY COMPLETE

Defending Wei-Hai-Wai,

Confirmation of the Reported Sinking of Chinese Warships-All Chinese Torpede Boats Either Captured or Sunk-American in Danger of Japanese Vengennee

LONDON, Feb. 14.-A Hong Kong dispatch says it is supposed that the Japanese will threaten Foo Chow, capital of the province of Fukien, after they have so ured Wel-Hai-Wei. The Chinese are preparing for the defense of that pine dispatch adds that officers of the British warship Spartan have assived in Hong Kong. They confirm the statement that three Chinese warships, two of them being iron clads, were sunk at Wei-Hai-Wei, and that all the Chinese torpede boats were either captured or sunk. They state that eight torpedo boats went out of the harbor apparently with the Intention of attacking he Japanese fleet, but instead of doing so they ran along side of the Japanese flag-ship, and then surrendered. Some of the torpedo boats were run ashore and their crews escaped by jumping to the land.

A dispatch from Shanghai says that or ders have been given from Pekin to mobilize the large forces in Tsing Chow to re-lieve Wei-Hai-Wei. Tsing Chow is in the province of Shan Tung, in which Wei-Hai-Wei is also situated, and is about 220 miles west by south of Wei-Hai-Wei.

A dispatch from Kobe, Japan, says that according to statements by Chinese prisoners at Wei-Hal-Wei there are seven for-eigners in the fort on the island of Lui Kung Tao, five of them being Englishmen, one a German and one an American the latter being one of the three men for-merly arrested at Kobe on the French steamer Sydney. The Island is victualed for five months. Coal is plentiful, but ammunition is deficient. The garrison is

determined to fight to the last.

If the American mentioned as being in the fort on Lui Kung Tao Island is John Wilde, and he falls or has fallen into the hands of the Japanese it will go hard with him. When the French steamer Sydney arrived at Kobe at the beginning of No vember last she was boarded by Japanese officers, who arrested three of her passen gers-Wilde, a Scotchman named Cameron and a Chinaman, Cham Tam Moore who was one time interpreter to the Chi-nese legation at Washington.

They were taken into disissly on sus-

picion of being engaged in an enterprise against Japan, and it was subsequently learned that they were engaged in a scheme to destroy the entire Japanese navy. It appears that Wilde's plan was to throw from a torpedo hoat shells filled explode, creating an impenetrable suffocating smoke, under cover of which attacks could be made with torpedoes. The men were, it was said, to from China \$1,000,000 for each Japanese squadron they destroyed and a proportionate sum for every Japanese merchantman they succeeded in blowing up.

After being detained for some time Wilde and Cameron were released after taking oaths not to do anything to assist China during the war. Moore, the Chinaman, was sent to Hiroshima. If Wilde has violated his oath the Japanese will be apt to punish him summarily.

The Chinese peace envoys, who returned to Nagasaki from Hiroshima after having been informed by the Japanese representatives that their powers were not considered full enough for them to undertake peace negotiations, left here on Tuesday for China, having been notified by their government to return to that country. Their recall will be followed soon by the appointment of Li Hung Chang and either Prince Kung or Sir Robert Hart, in spector general of the Chinese customs, to act as high commissioners and plenipotent finites to arrange terms of peace. This step is taken on the advice of the miniters of the foreign powers:




