



VANDERBILT DIVORCE

Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt Gains Every Point Asked For.

SHE IS FREE TO MARRY ANOTHER.

Her Ex-Husband, However, Cannot Wed Again Without Becoming a Bigamist. Mrs. Vanderbilt Retains Possession of Her Children and Secures Liberal Allowance.

NEW YORK, March 6.—Judge Barrett, of the supreme court, granted a decree of absolute divorce in favor of Mrs. Alva E. Vanderbilt from her husband, William K. Vanderbilt, the well known millionaire. Although a liberal allowance has been granted Mrs. Vanderbilt, there is no record of the sum which her husband has agreed to give her. The only paper the public can examine is the decree of divorce.

Mrs. Vanderbilt is to have the care and custody of her three children—Constancia, William K., Jr., and Harold, with the proviso that they shall be educated in the United States. Their father shall not be prevented from communicating with them at any time. The decree further decides that "it shall be lawful for the said

Embezzling Bankers Sentenced.

NEW BLOOMFIELD, Pa., March 6.—Yesterday William A. Sponser and Benjamin F. Junkin, the ex-bankers, convicted of embezzlement, were brought before Judge Bell for sentence. The judge imposed a fine of \$30 each and costs and imprisonment in the Eastern penitentiary for one year. The case will be appealed to the supreme court.

Woman Suffrage Defeated.

BOSTON, March 6.—The bill to grant full municipal suffrage to women in Massachusetts was defeated in the lower legislative body by a vote of 157 to 87. The question was on ordering the bill to a third reading. The motion brought out an immense audience of women and occasioned lively debate by the legislators.

A Setback for Women Lawyers.

PHILADELPHIA, March 6.—The house bill providing for the admission of women to the examinations for license to practice law in this state was defeated in the senate last night, it receiving two less than the necessary votes. Seven senators were absent, however, and the bill will be brought up again.

Broke a World's College Record.

AMHERST, Mass., March 6.—Henry W. Lane, a senior in Amherst college, broke the world's college record for strength in the Pratt gymnasium yesterday. Nash, of Tufts, has a record of 1,322, and Klein, of Harvard, has become famous with 1,423 points, but Lane scored a total of 1,650 points.
