MAY TAKE COMMAND IN CUBA. Marshal de Campos Ready to Assume the

Responsibility. London, March 7.—A dispatch to The Standard from Madrid says that Marshal Martinez de Campos, who was given the title of "Pacificador de Cuba," owing to his successful efforts some years ago to restore tranquility in the island, has returned to Madrid from Paris, where he had been vis-iting. He has had several interviews with Infanta Isabella, Prime Minister Sagasta, the minister of war and the minister of the colonies, and has promised to accept the command in Cuba whenever he shall be appointed to it. It is probable that he will be appointed at once.

Marshal de Campos was appointed to the

governor-generalship of Cuba in 1876, and it was due to him that the insurrection that broke out in 1868, and lasted ten years, was brought to an end. Upon the expiration of his term of office he returned to Spain, and has since taken a prominent part in national affairs, notably in the Melilla affairs.

General Catleja, captain general of Cuba, has sent a dispatch to the government, asking that the reinforcements for the troops in the island be sent direct to Santiago de duba, equipped and ready to take the fleid. The war office is hurrying the preparations and there is great enthu slasm in military circles at the prospect of a campaign. Detachments from the various garrisons to form the first seven battallons are mustering fast at Santander Cadiz, Coronna and Barcelona, from which ports they will embark at the end of the week. The cruiser Mercedes will carry to Cuba 2,000,000 cartridges.

Secretary Quesada at Tampa-TAMPA, Fin., March 7 .- Gonzalo Que sada, secretary of the revolutionary party, arrived here yesterday. He comes from New York, but not direct. He was seen he was going, or how long he would re-main. It was he who acted as courier for the American revolutionary organization, carrying papers as far as Key West on Feb. 3, where they were entrusted to another, who carried them to the different leaders on the island. Vindication for Recorder Taylor. WASHINGTON, March 7.—The libel case of C. H. J. Taylor, the colored recorder of deeds for the District of Columbia, against W. Calvin Chase, the editor of a local negro organ, was closed yesterday, and the jury returned a verdict of guilty. The defense filed a motion for appeal and intends to carry the case to the district court of appeals. Taylor was charged with gross immorality both in and out of office and with making illegal political assessments.

NEW YORK, March 7 .- A most successful est was made last evening of the new weather signals constructed by the weather burean in the tower of the Manhattan Life Insurance company's new building, at 66 Broadway.

Sergeant Elias B. Dunn, the local forecaster, and several others, including re-porters, made their way up a spiral staircase from the seventeenth to the twenty-fourth

winds and hurricanes, the white light a frosty morning, and red and white high westerly winds; a flash light with a green shade will indicate a cold wave.
