GREENHUT BELLIGERENT

The President of the Whisky Trust Deposed by the Stockholders, BUT WILL MAKE A LEGAL FIGHT.

He Denounces the Charges of Mismanagement and Malfeasance, and Brings Suits for Heavy Damages Against Several Directors of the Trust.

PERIA, Ill., April 18.—The whisky trust reorganization committee carried yesterday's annual stockholders' meeting of the Distilling and Cattle Feeding company by storm, and when they adjourned had deposed ex-President Greenhut, elected a full board of directors and empowered the board to take any necessary action towards recovering from the trust's late officials any property that may be due to the corporation.

But Mr. Greenhut was not at all docile, being present at the meeting with objections at every turn, refusing to resign as director, and before adjournment he personally superintended the serving of papers in eleven libel suits of \$50,000 each.

The following is the company's new directorate: Samuel M. Rice, Walter M. Scheffel and T. H. Wentworth of New York, J. M. Hutton of Cincinnati, William J. Meyer, John M. Mott and Floyd E. Jenkinson of Chicago.

As there was no quorum of directors present the election of officers will be held in Chicago in the near future, when Samuel M. Rice, of New York, will very probably be chosen to succeed Joseph B. Greenhut as president.

There was no fight over the election, the slate having been prepared in advance, and Greenhut's attorney simply gave notice that the election of seven men was illegal, as the ex-president had not yet resigned.

In his annual report Mr. Greenhut declared his accusers to be slanderers and falsifiers, denied absolutely all charges of mismanagement, and asserted that the present receivership is proving disastrous to the company.

The report was in part as follows: "The recent very general, oft repeated accusations and charges against myself and fellow directors, I wish here to stigmatize as false, malicious and untrue, and I trust that time and opportunity will soon be at hand when the utter groundlessness of these slanderous charges can, and will be established, and the slanderers dealt with as they deserve."

"After the receivers were appointed I personally gave them all the assistance I could, and should have continued to do so but for the unwarrantable and unjustifiable assault upon me personally by breaking into my safe and examining my papers. I propose to resent this indignity and encroachment upon my private rights to the fullest extent of the law."

"It is a well known fact that the receiver has been, or will be in the future, a heavy loser. The receiver maintained the combination prices, and stored his goods, while competing distilleries unloaded their stock at paying prices, leaving the receiver at the date of the disruption of the pool recently with his manufactured product on hand, to be sold at less than cost, while his competitors, selling their goods at a profit while he was maintaining prices, can now afford to, and undoubtedly will store, while the goods of the company are being put upon the market at a loss."

The defendants in the Greenhut libel suits professed to be much amused by the affair. "It is a childish and foolish net," said Levy Mayer. "Of course we all feel very sorry for each other, and particularly for General McNulta, but the whole thing will come to naught."

Wayland and Brutally Beaten. PHILIPSBURG, Pa., April 18.—James Heath, one of the auditors of Rush township, residing at Sandy Ridge, was waylaid and brutally beaten last Tuesday night while on his way home by a gang of men who had taken umbrage at his refusal to pass upon certain accounts of Overseer of the Poor Austin Linn. Heath's condition today is regarded as critical. He would probably have been killed outright had it not been for the opportune arrival of his son William, who attacked and routed the gang.

Oil Takes a Downward Jump. PITTSBURGH, April 18.—The break in the oil market came at 2:30 yesterday afternoon, and it descended upon the Pittsburgh exchange like a thunder storm. The market had been hovering about 2.02 all the afternoon, but at 2:30 the slump began, and in a short time it had gone from 2.02 to 2.10. This was within a few minutes of closing time, and it rallied seven points, closing at 2.17. Similar reports came from all other sections.

Providence Weavers on Strike. PROVIDENCE, R. I., April 18.—About thirty weavers in the Geneva mill struck yesterday. They said they left because the weavers are being discharged one by one and an attempt was being made to freeze them out. Overseer Uelman stated that he had no orders, and consequently could offer no employment. The question of wages was not involved.

BATTLE IN OKLAHOMA.

Factional Political Differences Result in Bloodshed. SIX PERSONS KILLED THUS FAR.

Another Fight Expected at Any Moment Between the Friends of Governor Moseley and His Opponents—A Special Session of the Legislature Called.

GUTHRIE, O. T., April 18.—Couriers just arrived here from Tishomingo, the capital of the Chickasaw nation, report that a battle is raging between Governor Moseley and 300 insurgents. Six people have been killed and eight wounded, so the report says, and the greatest excitement prevails.

On Tuesday morning Governor Moseley issued orders to all sheriffs, constables and deputies throughout the nation to report to him at once with arms.

The Dominion Government Sustained. TORONTO, April 18.—The election which took place in Haldimand yesterday to fill a vacancy in the Dominion parliament was more important than is usual with a bi-election, from the fact that it is the first time that an Ontario constituency has spoken since the order was issued from Ottawa suggesting relief for the Roman Catholic minority in Manitoba.

Break in the Iowa Miners' Strike. OTTUMWA, Ia., April 18.—A break has come in the coal mining trouble. The troops have been withdrawn from Cincinnati, and many miners are going to work.

MURDERED BY HER PARAMOUR. MORGAN CITY, La., April 18.—Adolph Scherrick, a member of the Boyland protective police in New Orleans, shot Maliee Francoise three times in the head, killing her. He then placed the revolver against his temple and killed himself.

Not Guilty of Attempted Train Wrecking. MAY'S LANSING, N. J., April 18.—Fred Gondora, Pospello and Peter Quardino, the three Italians who were arrested for an alleged attempt at train wrecking on the Camden and Atlantic railroad in February last, were put on trial here yesterday.

Colliery to be Closed Down. WILKESBARRE, Pa., April 18.—The Colverine colliery, one of the oldest in the Lehigh region, will shut down on Saturday for an indefinite period, owing to the low price of anthracite coal.
