SOMETHING TO SUIT YOU.

New Form of Communition and Package Tickets on the "Pennsy."

For the beter accommodation of its pa rons the Pennsylvania Bailroad Company will, on June 1, introduce a new form of commutation ticket to and from Philadelphia, designed to superseds the school, monthly and quarterly tickets; in use. This arrangement will be placed in effect on the New York Division between Philadelphia and Trenton, the Germantown and Chestnut Hill Branch, the Trenton Cut-off and Cresheim Branch, the Schuylkill Division as far as Pottstown, the Frazer Branch, the Main Line as far as Parkesburg, the West Chester Branch, the Central Division of the Philadelphia, Willimington and Baltimore Railroad batween Philadelphia and West Chester, and the Philadelphia and Delaware County Railroad.

The new ticket will be good for one hundred rides within twelve months of the date of issue; it will be subject to the usual restrictions governing the use of commutation tickets, being a non-transferrable ticket, not good to stop off. The rate will approximate the rates heretofore in use on sixty trip tickets, but the generous limit will permit of the use of every one of the one hundred rides provided for in the ticket, even if purchased not find ready supporters, and, of course on the eve of an extended absence from business.
