### A STRONG APPEAL.

Which are Awalting the Action of The Commissioners to Circulate Petitions and Present the same to the Governor.

The Commissioners of this county will use every effort to induce the Governor not to approve the Quay County Hill, That portion of Schuylkill county which is proposed to take to make up Quay county comprises the three Unions, Rann, Kline, Rush and Ryan townships. The loss of these townships, it is claimed, will "bring unnecessary burdens and inconveniences" upon the citizens of old Schnylkill and strong appeal will be made to the people residing in the townships nam-d above oppose the dismemberment of their old county.

Petitions will be circulated in the townships named and the commissioners started out to-day to place the papers in the hands of the taxpayers for their signatures. The petition opens with greeting to Gover nor Hastings and reads as follows:

"We the undersigned citizens and tax-payers of that portion of Schuylkill county intended to be incorporated into a new county respectfully request you to veto bill known as the "Quay County Bill" because if it becomes a law it would be detrimental to our interests, bring upon us unnecessary burdens and inconvenience us in many respects.'

Symbols of the "Cloud Fire,"

Nearly all of the ancient nations called lightning by names signifying "cloud fire," and the major portion of them employed some symbol to represent the flash of the "forked fury" darting from the thunderclouds. The early Chaldcans symbolized it with a trident, and tha Babylonians, learned in mystic lore, employed a human hand for the same pur-The bas-reliefs of the towers of Nimrud and Malthia, which are the work of the later and more refined Assyrian artists, show the trident doubled or trans formed into what is known as a "trifid fascicle." This triumph of the classic art secured for the ancient Mesopotamian symbol the advantage over all other representations of the thursderbolt. The Greeks represented the "st erm fire' with the feathers of a bird of prej . Later on, when they had begun to incorporate the Asiatle form of the symbol with their own, they put it in the claws of an angle and made it the scepter of Zeus. Gaul received the symbol from Italy, but soon altered it to the fa-miliar two headed hammer sommon on Gallo-Roman monuments. The ame sym-bol is seen on amulets found in rmany, Scandinavia, England and France.-St Louis Republic.


