SPANISH BRAVERY.

Details of Gomez's Destruction of San Geronimo.

BRAVE LIEUTENANT'S PORTITUDE.

Though Overwhelmed by Superior Numbers, He and His Men Fought Nobly Until Driven from Their Garrison by Smoke. Gomez's Tribute to Courage.

HAVANA, June 29.—The facts about the raid and the burning of San Geronimo, news of which has been already cabled to the Associated Press, as they are learned in more detail, are found to be of import.

San Geronimo is the most flourishing village in the province of Puerto Principe, and possesses several warehouses. It is situated about twenty-five miles from the town of Puerto Principe.

About 5 o'clock in the evening Maximo Gomez appeared near San Geronimo, at the head of 1,500 men. He sent to the commander of the village, saying that he must surrender or run the risk of being killed, either by bullets or fire.

At sunrise Gomez ordered the mayor of the town to tell the Spanish lieutenant that he had the town surrounded, and that he must surrender immediately.

The officers and soldiers, with tears in their eyes, revealed in their faces the anguish they felt at their surrender, to which they consented although quite haughtily.

Killed with a Baseball Bat.

WASHINGTON, June 29.—James A. Newsom, of Memphis, Tenn., aged about 50 years, for a long time one of the doorkeepers of the house of representatives, was struck on the head several times Thursday night with a baseball bat in the hands of Lewis Berry, the 20-year-old son of a fresco painter at the Capitol.

HALIFAX, N. S., June 29.—News of a disaster at Tack Beach, near Placentia, N. Y., was brought here by the mail steamer. A fishing smack on the way to the grounds went down when a few miles from shore with all on board.

ST. LOUIS, June 29.—City employes in the various municipal departments are being sifted over, and scores who have failed to register and vote are being dropped from the rolls for their negligence.

Theft of Mail Clerk Sentenced.

COVINGTON, Ky., June 29.—Judge W. H. Taft yesterday sentenced Edward Crittenden, a grandson of ex-Governor Crittenden, of Kentucky, to serve eighteen months in the Ohio penitentiary for rifling mail matter at the Frankfort postoffice, where he was employed.

San Francisco's Fire Loss.
