PILGRIMS MEET DEATH.

Terrible Accident on a Canadian Railroad.

THIRTEEN OF THE VICTIMS DEAD

Twenty-five Others Seriously Injured, and Some of These May Dis-The Accident Probably Due to the Carelessness of an Engineer Who Is Dead.

QUEBEC, July 10.—A terrible accident occurred on the Grank Trunk railway at Crags Roads Station, about fourteeen miles west of Levis, at 3 o'clock in the morning, as the result of which thirteen persons were killed and twenty-five others iore or less seriously injured, two of whom may die.

Windsor Mills and Richmond had left
the latter town for the famous Catholic shrine of St. Anne de Benupre. The train carrying the pilgrims was divided into two sections one running a few minutes behind the other. The first section reached Crags Road about 3 o'clock, and stopped at the tank to take water. Due procautions were taken and the samualters was tions were taken, and the samaphore was thrown to mark "danger" against the following train.

Only the trainmen were astir. The Pullman in the rear was wrapped in silence, the sleepers all unconscious of the terrible fate that was rushing upon them. Suddonly the second section, which had passed the semaphore at full speed, dashed into the rear Pullman of the first section. The engine embedded itself in the sleeper and the latter plantage of the section of the latter plantage of the section.

and the latter plunged forward and par-tially telescoped the next car in front.

Every berth in the sleeper was filled, and many of the occupants were killed as they sleph. Others awoke to their horri-ble approved. ble surroundings maimed, bleeding and brulsed, conscious of little else but the agony that racked them. It was not the

shattered engine rose in clouds that blinded all observation for the time being.

The reason why the second section did not observe the danger signal will probably never be known, as both the engineer and firemen were killed. It is believed, however, that the engineer, McLeod, had fallen asleep at his post. No other explanation seems possible, as there evidently had been no attempt to stop the speed of the onrushing train.

The Pullman conductor, Mr. Moore Wood, had a narrow escape. He had luckily stepped out on the rear platform just in time to see the oncoming train and up, then turned completely over. The rest of the second train was derailed and badly smashed up. In an instant after the crash sengers. The few train hands and station employes on the spot set to work manfully and extricated the passengers as quickly

Mr N. J. Quinlan, the Grand Trunk passenger agent, who was on the first train, is not seriously wounded, and in conversation with an Associated Press correspondent said he could not say how he escaped death, as the Pullman he was in was completely shivered into splinters. The porter of the Pullman at the time of the collision, Bennett Basier, said he could not account for the accident. At the time, he was putting up a berth in the Pullman. P. McHugh, one of the in-jured, said he was sitting in the car in front of the Pullman when the accident occurred. He saw the locomotive of the second train coming through his car and he was only saved by a friend.

The arrival at Levis of the train bearing wounded passengers from the scene of the accident beggars description. Hundreds had congregated at the station at Levis and numerous express wagons containing mattresses and pillows were awaiting the arrival of the train. The poor victims were covered with blood and their clothes were torn to shreds.

The scene in the Hotel Dieu after the arrival of the wounded was a sad one. The unfortunate pilgrims all occupied beds in the different wards of the hospital, and were attended by physicians of Levis and Quebec, and nunsand ladies of Levis. The cries of some of the wounded were fearful as they were attended by the physicians. The dead are: Charles Bedart, mail
