Unwearied by the fervor of the huge morning meetings in these centers, not tired by the earnest efforts of the neon rallies in a dozen

places where congregate the tollers of Bos-ton, and unsatisfied with the encouragement gained at the fifteen general com-mittee meetings in the afternoon, the Christlans gathered 25,000 strong at the ig mootings.

At Mechanics' Hall building the ad-dress of Rev. A. C. Dixon, D. D., of Brook-lyn, attracted thousands, while other thousands were drawn to tent Williston by the announcement of an address by Rev. Henry Montgomery, of Belfast, one of the ecclesiastic triumvirate of Europe -Spurgeon, Brown and Montgomery.

--Spurgeon, Brown and Montgomery, Pennsylvanians were partial to Me-chanics' building, because Rev. T. J. Mo-Creery, D. D., of Pittsburg, widely and favorably known throughout the Ksy-Among other good speakers at tent E. deaver was Rev. Heyl Delk, of Hagers-town, Md., whose subject was "The Centrality of Christian Fellowship."

At tents Endeavor and Williston the five minute greetings of Endeavorers from the corners of the earth, constituting that part of the program designated "The Par-liament of Nations," were both encouraging and instructive, and at all three meet ings the presentation of a banner to a lo cal union for best work in promoting local followship was a happy incident.

The other speakers at the meetings were received with that warmth that has been the spirit of the convention, and especially does this apply to the report of the "Senior Mothers" or parent society, which was given at Mechanics' building by Rov. H. W. Kinney, of Syracuse, N. Y. This is comparatively a new feature of the Endeavor society, and its increase, as Indicated in the reports, produced marked enthuslasm.

In tent Endeavor the presentation of the banner to the local union showing the best work for promoting Christian En-deavor feilowship was made to the Philadelphia union. 


