BLOODTHIRSTY REELS

Everybody at Jackson's Hole Reported Killed by Them.

THE NEWS CONSIDERED AUTHENTIC

Fears That the Indians Will Continue Their Murderous Raid All Down the Teton Valley—Government Troops Hurrying to the Front.

POCATELLO, Idaho, July 27.—William Ross, of the firm of Ross, Grey & Wynant, who has just arrived at Market Lake from Jackson's Hole was killed yesterday morning.

Gov. Sargent arrived in Market Lake yesterday from the vicinity of Jackson's Hole. He left a companion in the country who intended to get into the Hole if possible.

M. J. Gray, L. M. Tart and Senator Hamer, of Illinois, and T. R. Hamer, of St. Anthony, all left St. Anthony yesterday morning on a fishing trip to Jackson's Hole, taking no stock in the war.

One of the Denver News' couriers, just returned, got far into Teton Basin, which is the present point in danger of massacre, now that the Jackson's Hole citizens are all butchered.

Two hundred Utes were seen to have gone to the north to join the Indians in Hoback Basin early this week.

People in St. Anthony, Colorado, and other towns located in Idaho between the railroad and Jackson's Hole have been all along placing no confidence in the Indian scouts who they called it.
