TURKISH ATROCITIES.

No Permanent Relief for Persecuted Armenian Christians.

PROHIBITED FROM GIVING AID.

Agents Sent to Distribute Aid Contributed by British Christians Constantly Hampered in Their Work by Representatives of the Turkish Government.

New York, Sept. 4—The following statement has just been received by a gentleman in this city from responsible persons in Turkey, fully cognizant of the

However, the amount that they have been called upon to receipt for up to the present time has not been sufficient to prove burdensome. Of the £2,000 only £400 has yet materialized, and nearly £2 per day goes for salarles of the commission.

When agents were appointed by the British ambassador to distribute the funds from abroad it was with some difficulty that permission was secured for them to enter the devastated region. The services of the existing Turkish commission were offered to distribute these contributions, but finally this point was apparently waived, and they were allowed to locate themselves at the village of Semal.

VIRGIN OF GUADALOUPE.

Opposition to the Patron Saint of Mexican Indians

MAY LEAD TO SERIOUS TROUBLE.

Americans Regret the Attitude of Missionnviewin Endeavoring to Uproof a Popular Superstition-Few Catholic Households in Mexico Without the Virgin's Image.

CITY OF MEXICO, Sept. L-There is some fear lest the recent circular of the Protest-ant missionaries attacking the popular belief in the Virgin Gaudaloupe may arouse the inherent fanaticism of the Indians who will flock into the city in great numbers in October, during the coronation festivities, the number estimated being from 75,000,000 to 100,000,000. Some Am erionus recret the action taken by the missionaries who, however, defend their pool tion as being already fully supported to eminent Catholic prelates of former centur-ies, who protested against the adoration of the Virgin of Guadaloupe, denouncing It

The belief in this apparition of the virgin is shared by many thousands of upper class people, and there is certain to be deep feelgaroused when the missionaries begin to diroulate their projected dally paper, de-voted to crafficating what they term a pop-ular superstition. Radical liberal papers applied warmly the proposed action of the missionaries, and are inciting them in their course of disseminating literature calculated to overthrow this ancient be-

The Virgin of Gundaloupe is cherished here as much as Our Lady of Lourdes in France. Miracles without number are ascribed to her intervention and there are few Catholic households in the country without her image. Evidently a tremendous religious controversy is in prepara

Threatened Strike Trouble in Cleveland. CLEVELAND, Sept. 4.—When the Banckes Wire Nail works passed into the possession of the Consolidated Wire and Steel company and it was shut down for repairs. the 400 employes declared that they would not return to work unless they were paid the prices won by the other wire mill men of Cleveland in their recent strike. Yes-terday the company tried to get forty men imported from Pennsylvania into the mill, but the strikers induced them to turn back. A large squad of police was sent to the mill, but the imported workmen finally scattered, many of them declaring that they would return home. Serious trouble is apprehended, as the company is deter mined to start the mill at its own wages.

Senator Gorman's Confidence. BALTIMORE, Sept., 4.—Senstor Gorman, in discussing the future of the Democratic party and the present situation in Mary-land, said: "I have observed that political conditions affecting the state of Maryland, and particularly affecting the Democrati purty, come in cycles. So far as the parry is concerned, there was a seemingly ad-verse wave in 1875. Ten years later, in 1885, there was a little disturbance. This year, according to the political almonne, another phenomenon is to be anticipated. But in my mind there is no more apprehension as to the results to the Domo cratic party than in the former periods

Alleged Bribery Scheme Checked.

New York, Sept. 4.—A rumor was recently published that the subordinates of the city police force were forming an organization to have for its object the raising of a fund of \$80,000 to influence members of the next legislature to defeat plans for reorganization of the force. Little credence was placed in the seport by the public but Commissioners Roosevelt and Parker, acting upon it, or upon other information, took steps to checkmate the scheme by directing Acting Chief Conlint to notify each capitain to read an order to his men at midnight forbidding them to contribute to such fund.


