



It Is Proposed to Bring the Women's Relief Corps and Ladies of the G. A. R. Into One Organization in Order to Carry Out Their Work on a Greater Scale.

LOUISVILLE, Sept. 10 .- Probably the most important business that will be transacted at the present encampment will be the joining of the Women's Relief Corps and the Ludles of the G. A. R. in one order. While it has not been fully determined to do this, it will be recommended, and the sentiment in its favor is such that there is hardly a doubt of the consummation of the plan. The Woman's Relief Corps has expended in the neighborhood of a million dollars in charitable purposes. It works through all channels while the other body, being confined in its labers to the wives and relatives of the veterans, is necessarily limited. If the proposed plan is carried out the work will be on a greater scale than has ever been known before.

The vessels of the equadron were profusely decorated with flags and bunting. were equipped and surrendered to Rear Admiral Allen, commanding the National Association or Navai Veterans, by Captain George Fritchner.

Governor John Young Brown, Admiral Allen and others made addresses at the dog watch of the naval veterans last night. Campfires were held in New Albany and Jeffersonville as well as in Louisville, while receptions were tendered Com-mander Lawler, Admiral Allen, Mrs. Logan, Mrs. Wallace and others. At Cump Caldwell, where twelve state departments and thousands of unattached veterans are quartered free in tents, there was singing and story telling and many very informal campfires. Most of the Indiana veterans are quartered at New Albany and Jeffersonville. The posts of many state departments are quartered in school houses and ofher buildings about the city. The schools were dismissed this week, and all school

buildings are used by the veterans.


