






A Telegram from the Porte to the Powers cent Disorders.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 8 - A new Turkish ministry has been formed, as follows: Hall Rifat Pasha, grand vizier; Said Pasha, president of the council of state; Tew-fix Pasha, minister of foreign affairs; Hassan Pasha, minister of marine; Riza Pa-sha, minister of war; Memduh Pasha, min-ister of the interior; Abdur Raimar Pasha, minister of justice; Sabri Pasha, minister of France; Arifi Pasha, minister without portfollo

a moderating influence between the Mus-sulmans and the Christians, but it is not thought that he will be able to do any-thing of a remarkable nature at the present serious juncture of affairs in the Turkish empire.

It is believed that the changes in the Turkish ministry are intended to appease Mahomedan disaffection, and are not a demonstration against England, although Kiamil Pasha, the outgoing grand vizier, was the most pro-English of the pashas. M. J. LAWLOR,

In an interview Said Pasha said he could not claim that the Turkish administration was not snow white, but it was certainly not as black as it was painted. The ministers, he said, were working hard to carry out the scheme of reforms, and counted upon England's generosity not to increase the difficulties by encouraging the revolutionary Armenians, who, instead of being grateful for the concessions that had been made, were in open revolt throughout Asia

The sublime porte has sent the following telegram to the powers:

"All news concerning plots, threatening letters and a supposed dissatisfaction in the ranks of the army and navy is intentionally propagated by well known news-paper correspondents, affiliated with the Armenian committee, to alarm public opinion. As for the often repeated assertion of the intended extermination of the Armenians, it is too absurd to be contra-dicted. The efforts of the imperial government, on the contrary, to quell the revolt of the Armenians and to resist their criminal and bloody agitation. "The Armenian agitation at Diarbekir

was on the point of subsiding when the Armenians began again their attacks upon the Mussulmans by throwing bombs at them, and by firing at the muezzins when the latter were calling the faithful to prayers. During the affray fifty Mussulmans and ninety Armenians were killed and wounded.

"Armenian rloters attacked the patrols at Sivrik, killing a few Mussulmans and setting fire to the bazaar. Two hundred Armenian revolutionists, having at their head Kevrok, chief of the parish of Ferus (Marash), attacked the village of Tchoukour Hissar and killed twelve Mussulmans. Some of the agitators were ar-rested, including part of the Armenian brigands who captured Hadji Hassan Oglous Husni.

It Results in the Death of a Whole Family of Six Persons.

DETROIT'S EXPLOSION HORROR.

Thus Far Over Thirty Bodles Have Been Recovered, and the Total Loss of Life Will Exceed Forty-An Engineer's Carelessness Caused the Disaster.

BBOOKLYN, Nov. 8 .- Six members of one family perished by fire in their home on the top floor of the four story tenement house at 311 Van Brunt street, at 1 o'clock in the morning. The names of the dead are: Charles Ryan, his wife, Ellen, and their daughters Johanna, 20 years old; Sarah, 17; Maggie, 14, and Lizzle, 12. The fire started from a gas jet in a hall on the ground floor. It burned out Finnegan's saloon on the


ground floor, and roused Margaret Welsh and her four children on the second floor. The stairway being on fire, they went to the windows, from which they were res-cued by policemen. The fire quickly got to the third floor, which was unoccupied.

After the flames had been extinguished a search of the building was made and on the top floor were found the dead bodies of the Ryans. Their positions showed plainly how they had struggled for their ives. Johanna and Sarah were found in the rear room near the staircase. Their bodies were lying together. Maggie's body was found lying within a few feet of the window on the King street side of the

## Armenians Have Acted Hastily.

LONDON, Nov. 8 .- The Dally News Constantinople correspondent, whose sympathics lean toward the Armenian side, ad-mits that the Moslem attacks have aroused such a spirit of opposition and despair among the Armenians that instead of al-lowing themselves to be killed quietly, as at Trebizond and Akhissar, the Arme-nians themselves commenced the attack at Zeltoun, Erzeroum and elsewhere, be-sides making ill advised and mischicous demonstrations in Constantinople. "It will take years," this correspondent continnes, "to revive confidence and trade and commerce lost through the present condition of anarchy due to the deplorable weakness and inaction of the government.

The Sultan Looking to His Own Safety.

LONDON, Nov. 8.-The Berlin correspondent of The Times says of Tewfik Pasha, the new Turkish minister of foreign af-fairs: "While here Tewfik displayed no qualities fitting him to be a good foreign minister. He has won the sultan's confi-dence by the timely detection of palace plots, and he is likely to be a docile palace instrument. It looks, therefore, as if the gultan were thinking more of his own afety than of the gravity of the political situation.

LOUISVILLE, Nov. 8.-It was the verdict of the spectators present and L. A. W. of-ficials in charge yesterday that "Johnnic" Johnson's work at Fountain Ferry stamps him as a marvel among bicycle riders. He made a trial against the standing start, paced, one mile world's record, held by Otto Ziegler, and though he rode over on third of a mile unpaced, he fied the record of 1.50 2-5. He tried it again within twenty minutes, and, notwithstanding a most miscrable pickup by the second quad, which carried him outside to the top of the bank, he lowered the record to 1.50 1-5.
