FIERCE WESTERN STORM. It Caused Great Damage in Chicago and Other Cities.

FEARFUL VELOCITY OF THE WIND. At Toledo, O., It Blew at the Rate of Eighty-one Miles an Hour—Street Cars Stalled in the Streets of Chicago—No Fatalities Reported.

CHICAGO, Nov. 27.—The storm which preceded the present cold snap here was one of the worst that ever struck this city. The wind blew a gale. Railroad traffic was seriously delayed...

On Lake Michigan the gale was very severe and the sea running very high. Comparatively few vessels are out at this time of year, and it is not expected that there will be much loss of life if any.

Coal Boats Wrecked. LOUISVILLE, Nov. 27.—No loss of life has been reported as a result of Monday night's gale, but much damage was done among the Ohio river towns in Kentucky and Indiana.

A Tug Sunk at Buffalo. BUFFALO, Nov. 27.—The gale here has subsided. The damage to various kinds of property has been very great, but no fatalities have occurred.

Church Blown Down in Indiana. ANDERSON, Ind., Nov. 27.—The wind blew at a hurricane speed here Monday night. The colored United church, a new building, was completely demolished.

Very Severe in Cleveland. CLEVELAND, Nov. 27.—One of the severest gales that ever struck this city began blowing from the south just after Monday midnight.

Little Damage at Cincinnati. CINCINNATI, Nov. 27.—While there was wind it was all in a small way. No loss of life or bodily injury is reported.

Storm Still Rages in Kansas. KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 27.—The recent storm reached its climax at 7:30 yesterday morning, when the mercury fell to ten

points above zero, nearly ten degrees lower than the lowest point in this section. The storm seriously affected the trains scheduled in this city...

Blowing Eighty-one Miles an Hour. TOLEDO, Nov. 27.—A terrific wind storm visited this city early yesterday morning, and played havoc with telegraph and telephone wires.

ARMENIAN MASSACRES.

It Is Estimated That Fully 40,000 Were Slain by Turks.

THE PROPERTY LOSS \$50,000,000. The Loss of Life Will be Increased by Starvation This Winter—Peculiar Reply of Turkish Authorities to a Private Request for Information.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 27.—Now that matters seem to be quieting down again here and in the Asiatic provinces, people are beginning to form estimates of the amount of damage done and the number of lives lost during the recent disturbances.

The officials at Tokat have taken measures for the discovery and restoration to the owners of all the articles stolen recently in the different villages, and with the exception of a few unimportant incidents complete quiet prevails throughout Marash and vicinity.

Official advice received here report the occurrence at Alintab of serious trouble consequent upon the Armenians wounding a soldier and four Mussulmans. The powers, instead of ordering their fleets away from Turkish waters, as the sultan earnestly requests, seem to be determined upon keeping them in this vicinity for an indefinite period.

Massacres by Official Orders. LONDON, Nov. 27.—The Times published an article written at Erzurum, dated Nov. 9. The correspondent says: "The massacres here certainly occurred by the order of the authorities, and this order must have emanated originally from the central authorities at Constantinople."

Jail Breaking Prevented. TRENTON, Nov. 27.—A proposed jail break was nipped in the bud at the state prison yesterday, and John Langenburg, William Speer and William C. Housell, the convicts who had prepared the scheme, were put in dungeons.

Convicted of Criminal Assault. NEW YORK, Nov. 27.—Walter L. S. Langerman, whose sensational trial for criminal assault on Miss Barbara Aub, has created a stir in this city for the past week, was convicted yesterday afternoon.

BOSTON, Nov. 27.—The completion of all business relating to the great Christian Endeavor convention, held here in July, was celebrated last night by a banquet at Hotel Brunswick, at which the now famous committee of thirteen sat down, with President Francis E.
