ACCIDENT MARS THE FIRST TRIP.

The Actual Running Time of the Train, However, Was 53.36 Miles Per Hour-A Very Satisfactory Performance Under Adverse Circumstances.

BUFFALO, Dec. 3.-The New York Central railroad yesterday demonstrated its ability to run upon its road the fastest regular train in the world, although it failed in this particular run to finish upon the schedule time laid out for it. This fallure was due entirely to accident, other ortions of the run showing conclusively that the fast scheduled time can be ac-complished and even excelled.

The record so far is as follows, taking the record of yesterday up to the time of the accident: Actual running time per hour of new Empire state express, 53,56 miles; old Empire state express, 51 miles; English road, 51.75 miles; gain of Empire state train over best record, LSI miles per hour

Up to six months ago the train known by to six months ago the train whown as the Empire state express had the world's record as a regular train for fast running. The London railway, of Eng-land, running from London to Aberdeen, began to run a trifle faster than the Em-pire state's record of 51 miles an hour. Vector there is no set a body festerday the Central began a new schedule for this train which necessitates a run of about two miles an hour faster than the English rival.

Leaving New York at 8:30 a. m., and with every condition against her, the train made more than three-quarters of the distance in even faster time than the new schedule calls for, which is 53½ miles an hour. The regular express had added to it a special car of Vice President Webb, weighing 105,400 pounds. In addition to this extra weight a drizzling rain was fall-ing, making the tracks extremely slippery. The run from New York to Albany, 142.88 miles, was made in 2 hours and 30 minutes. the train reaching that city 4 minutes ahead of the new schedule time and 9 min utes ahead of the old schedule.

Engine 999 pulled the train through to Syracuse, 214 minutes ahead of the new schedule and 12 minutes faster than the old, making a total gain of 21 minutes be-tween New York and Syracuse. Between Syracuse and Bochester the drizzling rain turned to snow, and the wind changed to a head wind of great resistance. Despite these conditions, the train rolled into Ro-

chester exactly on time. From Rochester as far as Churchville, 55 miles east of Buffalo, the stations were passed exactly upon schedule time. Just after passing Churchville, where the en gine takes water without stopping, the scoop caught on an obstruction in the trough and, dropping down, banged against the ties for at least a mile until the train could be brought to a standstill. When the train was again started, after a loss of 17 minutes, it was close upon the long heavy grade running up to Batavia, and it lost 8 minutes more on this up grade. When the Batavia station was passed the train was 2514 minutes behind

the new schedule. The run into Buffalo from Batavia, a distance of 40 miles, was made in about 31 minutes, and the train rolled into Buffalo 23 minutes behind the new schedule time and 2 minutes ahead of the old schedule. The entire run of 440 miles, including three stops and exclusive of a delay of 26 minutes, was made in 464 min-

NECESSITY FOR PROMPT ACTION. The Unfurling of the Green Flag of Mo-

hammed in Syria Means the Massaere of Both Jew and Gentile-Put an End to the Atrocities.

CHICAGO, Dec. 3 .- Rev. H. H. Van Meter, who prepared the "Missionary Mani-festo," bearing on the origin of the Chinese outrages, has completed another on "The Mohammedan Uprising," which he intends having translated and published in every newspaper in Germany, Russia, France, Austria and Italy. He says in

part: ^OThe awful atrocities in Armenia are to which merely Mohammedan mussacres, to which the bloody Turk would commit all mankind not Moslem. The cause of the Christians in Armenia, therefore, is not one of any particular race or religion, but of humanity at large, and of political and re-ligious liberty. Neither financial considerations nor national jealousles nor fra-ternal relationships should be permitted longer to prevent or delay the powers from fully enforcing peace and justice. "The unfurling of the green flag of the

Mohammed among the groups that are now overrunning Syria means not only the massacre of Gentile, but Jew as well. This is the signal of a holy war and the Moham sign of a general uprising of Moham-medans, which, unless met immediately by the prompt, united, powerful forces of Christianity, will spread until the armies of millions mark the beginning of an era of cruelty and bloodshed so terrible that the world may well shudder at the very thought of it.

'Can Christian nations listen longer quietly to the cries of despair that come to us, and either of greed of gold or ter-riforial aggrandizement or cowardles connive longer with crime? If Islam is allowed to gather itself together for the great death grapple of the ages in its final struggles with Christianity for the conquest of the world, beware f "Any nation that will permit its poli-

ticians to trifle longer or plot further for the possession of this abomination should be branded by the Christian world as unworthy of recognition in the councils of nations, and ostracized from all future alliance of civilization, for it is in the power of the people of Europe unitedly to put an end to these atrocities."


