The Captain Exonerated.

A CAESAREAN OPERATION.

Physicians of Town Successfully Accomplish a Delicate Undertaking.
At a o'clock this morning Dr. D. W. Straup, J. S. Kistler, M. S. Kistler and Frank Womler successfully performed the cesarean operation on Mrs. Frank Yodas, on North Chestnut street, in efforts to save her life. The woman suffered since last Sunday under the care of a midwife. The cause of the trouble was a deformity of the pelvis. Craniotomy was impossible and the doctors decided at midnight that cesarean section was the only relief.

This is the only case in which the different doctors interested have found this severe and dangerous operation necessary in their practice, which consists of over 4,500 cases. It is an exceedingly difficult and dangerous operation, and rarely performed. It takes its name from Julius Caesar, the method being used to bring him into this world. Mrs. Yodas was under the influence of chloroform during the operation and has rallied nicely. The doctors believe she will recover if inflammation and septic condition are not against her in the next 72 hours.
