

**APPEAL TO MINE WORKERS.**  
A Circular Letter Has Been Issued by the U. M. W. of A.

An important circular letter has been sent to each Local of the United Mine Workers of America in this region. Issued by the secretary of District No. 1, or the main district. In it he states that hereafter the preliminary steps of organizing new branches will devolve upon the officers of the several sub-districts, whose duty it is to canvass the locality where there is no branch of the order, call meetings and attend to all other necessary matters, so that the organizer need pay but one visit to any particular field.

"Thorough organization," the letter indicates, "is the only remedy that labor can have. Above, we are, comparatively speaking, mere pawns, and never did and never will receive the recognition that honest labor should at all times command; but united as one compact, thoroughly organized body, it needs no logic or force of reasoning to demonstrate with how much greater force our requests to right wrongs and redress injuries can be presented, and with how much greater respect and attention our demands will be received and considered."
