

VALUABLE WATER FRANCHISE.

An Important Purchase by the Girardville Borough Council.

GIRARDVILLE, Dec. 11.—The people of this town suffered very much for the want of water the past summer, their supply being principally from the Girard Estate reservoir. As a consequence the borough authorities have been negotiating for some time for the purchase of the rights and privileges of the Oak Grove Water Company, of Gordon.

This is one of the most valuable water franchises in the county. The water is a pure mountain stream, outside of the coal measures, and has never been known to fail. Even during the great drought of the past summer the streams never diminished, and flowed with force enough to supply several towns, if necessary.

The price agreed upon is \$7,000, and the borough will spend an additional \$30,000 to furnish the people with the water. A pumping station will be erected at Gordon to force the water to Girardville.

The first idea was to pump the water to the top of the mountain south of this town, and construct a reservoir there, from which point the water would naturally flow to all parts of the borough, but on the report of Alexander Potter, C. E., of New York, who made a careful study of the ground, it has now been decided to construct the pipe line directly to Girardville, by way of Fountain Springs, and on down along the base of the Tunnel mountain, and thence to Girardville. The State hospital can thus be supplied with an abundance of water, if other means of securing it should fail.

To do this will cost considerably less money than if the water was pumped to the top of the mountain. The plan has been thoroughly investigated, and found practical in every respect.

The site for a reservoir is an admirable one, and the conditions are favorable to a never-ceasing water supply.

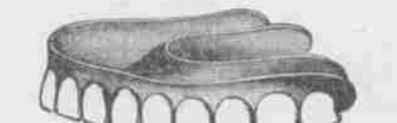
