MISERIES OF ARMENIA.

Kurds Continue Their Work of Pillage Without Interruption.

MANY GIRLS WITHOUT CLOTHING.

Wandering Through the Snow Piled Streets of Van Barefooted and Nearly Naked-It Is Feared That the Sultan Will Order a Massacre at Zeitoun.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 16 .- The French guard ship Faucou has arrived here, in ac-cordance with the permission granted by the sultan, upon the demand of the powers, and has joined the English gunboat Dryad, the Italian war vessel Archimede and the Austrian gunboat Sebenico.

which arrived during the week.

The secondary effects of the outrage perpetrated upon Armenians in the months. past are seen in the advices now being re-ceived from Austolia, which dwell upon the terrible distress existing everywhere. A thousand fugitives have taken refuge in Black sea ports, where they remain in a deplorable condition.

The Kurds continue to pillage the Ar menian villages without opposition from the helpless inhabitants or from the authorities. During the last three weeks 100 villages have been sacked and seventy men killed. The villages of Serai, Hazira, Bohaskessen, Hadjikishla Lim and the Armenian district of Halzalsor have been laid waste. The village of Lamasguird has been raided four times in one week The authorities make no attempt what ever to put a stop to the Kurdish raids or to punish the perpetrators of them.

It is feared that the inhabitants of num-bers of villages, who had fled through fear of threatened outrage and have taken refuge at inaccessible points in the mountains, will perish during the severe weather of the winter which is now coming on.

News is daily received here of thousands of Armenians who are offered the choice between Islam and death. At Marash an Armenian who was ordained an Anglican clergyman, refused the choice and was killed by slow torture. At Kharpoot two Protestant preachers and an Assyrian est was murdered for the same cause At Achime iffty-two persons died as martyrs to their religion. At Ouzoon a large number of Armenians were cap-tured and led to a neighboring Turkish village, where they were ordered to change their faith. Fifty of them rushed into the Euphrates and were drowned, the Turks shooting them while they were in the water. At Hob eight-five were killed.

The British vice consul at Van describes

the condition of the Armenians as being too appalling for words. Thousands of women and girls are wandering through the snow piled streets without shelter or food, and barefooted, their ravishers having left them only a chemise, and some of them only a cloth to cover their naked-

An oye witness of the barbarity of the massacre at Kaisarieh on Nov. 30 says that men and women were literally backed to pleces to the number of soveral hundred. Some of the Turks say that a thousand were killed. Saturday afternoon several thousand fierce fellows came from the villages in the vicinity. Many women were abducted. The troops could have squelched the business if they had desired to do so. The Armenians of Kaisarich were always quiet and law abiding. All this informa-tion is in the hands of the ambassadors, with names and dates.

The Zeitoun tragedy is approaching an end. At the Semanlik the sultan's secretary informed Europeans that the Zei tounlis committed a horrible outrage; that they has descended en masse from the hills, had burned the Moslem village of Maril, and had killed every inhabitant.

This is a foul lie, invented by izzet Bey the clover Arabic scoundrel who now rule the sultan and the empire. He maintains his power by pandering to the suitan's thirst for Armenian blood. Everybody is aware that Zeltoun was surrounded by troops and Bashi-Bazouks, and that such a sortic was impossible. The object of the falsehood is to alienate sympathy from the Armonlans. This means that the doom of the Zeitounils is sealed. The sultan means to seize an excuse to order their ex termination.

Governor Morton and the Presidency. NEW YORK, Dec. 16 .- The Morning Advertiser says: Levi P. Morton is an avowed candidate for the presidency. The Adver-tiser is able to make this announcement on what may be termed the best authority, During the present week, so a distinguished party leader told an Advertiser re-porter last night, the governor may conclude to take his friends into his confi dence and declare to them just how he feels about 1896. While he does not propose to personally exert himself, he will be pleased to have the New York delega-tion stand as firmly for his nomination at St. Louis as did the famous 306 for that of Grant in 1880.

Miss Ging's Life Insurance.

MINNEAPOLIS, Dec. 16.-W. W. Har-ward, father of Harry, has relinquished all claim to the \$10,000 insurance on Cather ine Ging's life, which was assigned to him by his son. This action is taken as an ad-mission that Mr. Hayward, Sr., is con-vinced of his son's guilt. Julia Ging. sister of the murdered woman, has made claim for the insurance money, but the insurance people will probably contest payment on the ground that the policies were assigned to Hayward.

To Fight DuPout's Confirmation. WILMINGTON, Del., Dec. 16.—Efforts are being made to secure eminent counsel to oppose, on the part of the Democrats of Delaware, the seating of Colonel H. A. DuPont by the United States senate Governor Watson will not appoint any coun-sel to represent the state, his authority to do so being doubtful. The counsel who may be engaged to oppose Colonel DuPont will be paid out of the contingent fund of the United States somete.

New Building Demolished by an Explosion Uniontown, Pa., Dec. 16.—The large fine brick residence of D. Ruby, which was nearly completed, was destroyed by an ex-plosion of gas. The gas accumulated from an open pipe in the cellar, and was ignited by the fire in the second story. The walls were rent asunder, windows blown out and all the plastering shaken off. The entire structure will have to be rebuilt.

"Coln" Harvey Launches His New Political Organization.

CHICAGO, Dec. 18.—W. H. Harvey, the apostle of free silver, who is better known as "Coin," resterday launched his new political party. According to the prospectus it is to be an oathbound secret organization with the title of "Patriots of Amer-ica." Its especial mission is to advance the cause of free silver, as well as to eliminate selfishness from politics, and it is expected to rapidly overcome all existing political parties.

The national officers are W. N. Harvey. first national patriot; Chares H. McClure, national recorder, and James F. Adams, national treasurer. Mr. Harvey was first elected head of the order, and he then ap-pointed Messrs. Adams and McClure, and the organization was declared complete. No salary attaches to any of the offices except that of national recorder, and Mr. McClure announces he will not accept this salary

On the first Tuesday of next April, when the organization is expected to be in good working order, an election will be held, and a new set of officers chosen or the present re-elected. The constitution expressly provides that no national officer can accept any elective or appointive office, nor can be acquire private property in excess of \$100,000.

A side order, called the Daughters of the Republic, is also to be started. Its mem-bership will be confined to the gentler sex. and the head of it will carry the proud title of the first woman of the republic. It is not to be a female suffrage organiza-tion, but rather a helping hand to the Patriots of America.

THE IRISH VOLUNTEERS.

Clau-na-Gaels Secretly Organizing to Set Old Ireland Free,

NEWYORK, Dec. 16.-A local paper says: For the last ten months a movement has been under way in the lodges of the Clan-na-Gaels in this and other large cities to organize among the best Irishmen mili-tary companies. In this city alone there is a well drilled and equipped regiment of 500 men, and companies and regiments are in process of formation in Brooklyn, Boston, Chicago and other large cities.

It is said that the whole movement is a cheme to prepare a well trained and armed body of men to be used when there is an opportunity to free Ireland. This scheme is deuled by the leaders of the movement who declare that the men are drilled for the purpose of furnishing the United States government with trained soldiers in case of an emergency, but notwith-standing this assertion it has leaked out that Iroland's cause is the principal object of the movement. One of the oaths which every recruit takes, it is said, is to serve the cause of Iroland. of Ireland.

No man can join a company unless he is a member of the Clan-na-Gael. After be coming a member of this organization he must be youched for by two well known Irishmen before he can enlist. He also must buy a distinctive uniform, and be willing to pay his pro rata share of the ex-penses of the movement.

It was always believed that he had been murdered, and his aged wife became insane over his disappearance and died a year ago.


