URGING FINANCIAL LEGISLATION.

House Republicans Decide to Ignore the Adjournment Resolution and Continue at Work-The Senate Passes the Venezuela Commission Bill Without Amendment.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21 .- Yesterday was a day of excitoment and surprises in Washington. Events moved with rapidity, and when the sun went down public men in all branches of the service were nervous and worn out from the tension Reports came of panic in securities throughout the country and here in Washington affairs moved at the rapid pace of a kateldoscope. The house Venezuelan commission bill was amended in material respects by the senate foreign relations committee, and then by a sudden change in sentiment in the senate was passed unanimously just as it came from the house. Then an adjournment resolution from today over the holidays was passed by the senate, only to be followed by an urgent message from the president, strongly advising prompt action for the reform of our currency system and the mainte

nance of public credit. At the other end of the avenue the pres At the other and of the avoid the post-ident and his cabinet received prompt ad-vices of the course of events here, and on the public exchanges. The cabinet held two sessions, something without precedent in recent years. Secretary Herbert, who returned from New York this after who returned from two lows this area noon, attended the second meeting for a brief time. All of the remaining mem-bars of the cabinet were present except Secretaries Lamont and Smith, who are out of town. The financial situation was the principal topic of conversation, and the result of the meeting was revealed in the message sent to the senate late in the afternoon, the body being kept in session by request from the White House for its

reception. The message was not favorably received in the senate. The summary adjourn-ment upon the motion of Senator Cockrell, one of the Democratic leaders, immediately after the conclusion of its reading, was taken on the Republican side as a dis-position not to consider the message seriously.

The action on the Venezuelan commission was the culmination of a debate adding a memorable page to congressional his-tory. It was a day of notable speeches by notable men. The subject of war between the United States and Great Britain was the prevailing theme, which found expression in lofty patriotic sentiments, in stirring appeals for preparation and defense, in graphic portrayals of the horrors of war, and at times in defiant warnings to the people across the water. By a singular coincidence the session

which was to be marked by such vigorous debate and action, was opened by an invocation of classic beauty from the blind chaplain of the senate, breathing the spirit of good will between the two prominent English speaking nations. This was speedily followed by the adoption of Mr. Allen's somewhat ironical resolution. calling on the finance committee to investigate the needs of the unlimited coinage of silver.

At all times during the four hours of discussion the galleries were besieged by an enger crowd, whose patriotic impulses found frequent expression in applause, which the presiding officer sought value to suppress.

The most notable utterances of the day were those of Sanators Sherman, Teller, Mills, Lodge, Platt, Turple, Chandler, White, Caffery, Call and Stewart, repre-senting the three shades of political senti-ment, and yet in the mnin uniform in urging the support of the president, vig-orous assertion of the Monroe doctrine, and, if need he, any action essential to maintain the national dignity. There were strong expressions, also, There were strong expressions, also, against the panic in American stocks and securities which it was said the London commercial houses were seeking to bring about. Throughout the debate, there was an undercurrent of feeling that, while the country would not shrink from war if it must come, such a calamity was not imminent.

Terrible Accident in a Mine Near Dr. Milcs' Heart Cure Docs

TWENTY-NINE LIVES SACRIFICED.

An Explosion of Firedamp Caused the Roof of the Mine to Cave In, Shutting Off the Air and Making It Impossible to Beach Even the Dead Bodies.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Dec. 21.-Twenty nine miners lost their lives yesterday in the Nelson mine, near Dayton, Tenn., by was explosion of firedamp. The explosion was succeeded by a terrific erash, which indicated that the roof of the passage which they had entered had fallen in. No avenue of escape was left and there is no possibility that any of the men will be

found alive. The mine is the property of the Dayton Coal and Iron company. The men, both white and colored, including several boys. entered the mine to go to work at 7 o'clock In the morning, but nothing of the awful entastrophe was known until 11 o'clock. when the miners at entry No. 10 found the way blocked by a solid wall of coal and slate

The entry where the unfortunate miners are entombed ran back more than two miles from the mouth of the mine. The mine is of the kind common in southern coal fields, known as a drift or level veined mine, worked in the direction of the vein. straight into the face of the mountain, but before the entry is reached a long slope extends to a level several hundred yards below, at an angle of about twenty degrees The cars are pulled up from the foot of the slope, where train cars, drawn by mules, connect with the outside by a cable, which hauls the coal up with re markable rapidity.

Rescuing parties worked all day and night trying to reach them, but it is probable they will be several days forcing an opening through the wall of the failen rooting, which must be made safe as they proceed. The foul air quickly exhautts the workers who are relieved by fresh hands. The work will continue day and night till the bodies are recovered.

He Urges Financial Legislation Before the Shenandoah and Vicinity Holiday Adjournment.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.-President Cleveland's financial message, which was not delivered to the senate until 4:30 yesterday afternoon, is in substance as follows: "In my last annual message the evils of our present financial system were plainly pointed out and the causes and means of the depletion of government gold were explained. It was therein stated that after all the efforts that had been made by the executive branch of the government to protect our gold reserve by the issuance of bonds amounting to more than \$162,000,-000, such reserve then amounted to but Beer and Porter. more than \$79,000,000, that about \$16,000,000 had been withdrawn from such reserve during the month next previous to the date of that message, and that quite large withdrawals for shipment in the immediate future were predleted. The contingency then feared has reached us.

"We are in the midst of another season of perplexity caused by our dangerous and farmous financial operations. These may be expected to recur with certainty as long as there is no amendment in our financial system. If in this particular instance our predicament is at all influenced by a recent instance upon the position we should occupy in our relation to certain questions concerning our foreign policy, this fur-nishes a signal and impressive warning that even the patriotic sentiment of our people is not an adequate substituted for a sound financial policy. "Of course there can be no doubt in any

thoughtful mind as to the complete vency of our hallon, nor can there be any just apprehension that the American people will be satisfied with less than an honest payment of our public obligations in the recognized money of the world. We should not overlook the fact, how ever, that aroused fear is unreasoning and must be taken into account in all efforts to avert public loss and the sacrifice of our people's interests.

"The real and sensible cure for our re-curring troubles can only be effected by a complete change in our financial scheme. Pending that, the executive branch of the government will not relax its efforts nor abandon its determination to use every means within its reach to maintain before the world American eredit, nor will there be any hesitation in exhibiting its confi-dence in the resources of our country and the constant patriotism of our people. 
