None of the Members Have Yet Been Selected.

President Roosevelt, of the New York Po-Hee Board, Hopes There Will be No Backdown, but ethers Have No Fear of Open Hostilities.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—Now that con gress has acted upon the president's suggestions in authorizing the appointment of the Venezuelan commission to locate the boundary line between British Guiano and Venezuela, and the subject is again one for executive treatment, it is believed that Secretary Olney will formally acknowledge the receipt of Lord Salisbury two notes and perhaps take occasion, as matter of courtesy, formally to advise the British government of the course which this government intends to pursue, sup plementing it, perhaps, by a request to be put in possession of evidence within the control of the British foreign office respecting the boundary line

Three or four of the officers of the cub-Inet were engaged in conference at intervals yesterday. The impression is that, in addition to talking over the financial conditions, they are interested in the per-sonnel of the Venezuelan commission. I is believed that the president already is in communication with some of the person whom he would be pleased to have under take this work, but in advance of their acceptance of membership their names wil not be made public, and consequently the composition of the commission is purely speculative at this time. There is no con firmation of the report that Chief Justic Fuller is to be president of the commis-sion, while it is authoritatively announced that the name of Ex-President Harrison has not been mentioned in connection

with the commission.

Representative Beach, of Ohlo, today in troduced a bill authorizing the preside to call an international conference of American republics to meet in this city within one year from the approval of the act for formal acceptance and declaration of the Monroe doctrine as a principle of international law.

Apparently without any definite authoritative origin, the rumor has gained currency that the commission will consist of one Democrat, one Republican and a dis-tinguished military or naval officer. Licu-tenant General Schofield and Rear Ad-miral Walker have been mentioned in connection with this rumor, but Admiral Walker could not well serve if a salary were attached to the place, in view of the recent law of congress which prevents of ficers of the government from drawing two federal salaries synchronously. DISCUSSING WAR RUMORS. What "Prominents" Now is New York Say About It.

NEW YORK, Dec. 24.—Senator Thomas H. Carter, of Montana, chairman of the Republican national committee, was at the Imperial hotel yesterday. Concerning the Venezuelan boundary dispute he said: "As I understand it, and I believe the public does, too, the commission will not be appointed to fix the boundary lines at all, but to let the American people know something about the nature of the dispute and the justice or injustice of England's claims. That commission will not settle the dispute at all, although the lan-

guage of the message so indicates."
Major H. B. Gillespie, of Colorado, said
he was for peace. "But if war does come,"
he added, "Colorado and the west will raise in a few days a million soldiers to

my state have telegraphed to the governor their desire to enlist." General W. S. C. Wiley, who is on Gov-ernor Morton's staff, said: "I think at a moment's notice we could put 12,000 eff tive soldiers of the national guard in the field. That is about the fighting strength of our military force in this state. In case of war I have no doubt the retired memhers of the guard would join again and raise the effective fighting force to 20,000 at the least. They could be placed on a war footing at once. They are nearly all sharpshooters."

President Roosevelt, of the police board, said: "I cannot too heartly praise the admirable message of President Cleveland He and Secretary Olney deserve the utmost credit. I am delighted that the house and senate rose to the level of the occasion OUR PLANS OF OPERATION AS- and acted in a spirit of broadminded patriotism. The essence of the Monroe doctrine is that the European powers shall not be permitted to increase their territories on American soil at the expense of independent American Mates. I hope there will be no backdown. We should stand

right up to the position we have taken."

Hon Charles W. Foster, of Ohio, who is stopping at the Fifth Avenue hotel, said: "Mr. Cleveland's message was quite a surprise to the country. He has been pandering to British sentiment so long, and his policy seemed so un-American in the dealings of the administration with other countries, that the starp way in which he takes up the Venezuelan question is as refreshing as it is pleasant to everyone. His message is patriotic through and through, and it meets with general approbation. It is time that some one called John Bull to time. Things are not going to end this time as they did in 1844, when England bluffed us out of a big

strip of land in the northwest." Senator R. F. Pettigrew, of South Dakom, who is also stopping at the Fifth Avenue hotel, said: "England probably will bribe the way with the Venezuelans to settlement of the boundary dispute. once the Venezuelans agree with the English about the due, then what we have done in the matter will seem more or less ridiculous. It will make a laughing stock of us. Why, England could invest a half million or so of dollars in Venezuels in the way of bribery or purchase money and settle the dispute in regard to the bor ary line. This is more probable than a
