HAVANA, Dec. 27,-Since the arrival here Wednesday night of Captain General Martinez de Campos from Matanzas he has been in conference with leading military and naval officials, the civil digni-taries, and the leaders of the different political parties. of the defeat and retreat of the insurgents have been made that it will require strong confirmation to make anybody here be-lieve that such is an actual fact. When the insurgents first entered the province of Santa Clara it was announced that they had been defeated with great loss, and had retreated across the border. But the next news received from the front was that the Cuban army was threatening Placetas, more than half way between the border and the capitol, Santa Clara, and since then they have apparently pushed on ward with little or no interruption.

The absence of news of the movements of the insurgents is causing some anxiety among their friends here, but they claim that Gomez and Macco are in possession of the railroad and telegraph lines, and that it was with difficulty that Campos succeeded in reaching Havana. Be that as it may, the only news obtainable is that furnished by rumor, and if the authorities are in possession of any additional facts all such matter is carefully suppressed.

In the meanwhile active preparations are being made here for the defense of the city and for forwarding to the front all the troops which can be spared. It is understood that the Spanish columns in the rear of the insurgent army have been ordered to concentrate as quickly as possible about the frontier of Matanzas, and that every effort is to be made to prevent the retreat

of the Cubans into Santa Clara. While these preparations are being made to apparently stop the insurgents from escaping back into Santa Clara, the land fortifications of Havana are receiving attiention day and night. A number of additional earthworks have been thrown up during the last month also, and these are being hastily completed and supplied with guns as rapidly as possible. The magazines are being plentifully supplied with ammunition, and the outposts of the Spanish troops around Hayana are being strengthened and more securely fortified.

The Plan Proposed by New York's Striking Tailors,

TO PREVENT STRIKES.

ABOLISH THE CONTRACT SYSTEM.

A Plan for the Establishment of Big Shore by the Brotherhood of Tailors, Which Will Accent Work Direct from the Manufficturers and Kill Sweat Shops.

NEW YORK, Dec. 27.-There is no change in the situation of the failors' strike. None of the tion have exturned to work, and say they will not do so until the contractors accept their terms. The latter are quite as fitnily determined not to yield a single domaid of their striking couplays. Not or side have yet broken their pledges, and it seemed today as if the strikers realised that the contractors were a unit against granting the slightest concession.

Leadors Schwarfeld and Robinson visiteit all the down town manufacturers yester-day and told them that nothing in the world could induce the strikers to retarm to the swear shop system which the root tractors were trying to force upon them, and the manufacturers promised to op-pose the re-introduction of the system. Elated with their success, Schoenfeld

and Robinson hearity called a mass meeting in Walhalla half in the afternoon, and afterwards held an excentive meeting. There they matured a plan which may put an end forever to the contractors and their sweat shop system, and may prevent any more strikes from taking place around the journeymen tailors of New York. This plan was considered at a second executive meeting has night. Secretary Herman Robinson briefly explained it. He said: "We are there of strikes and want to re-move the second sec



The contractors, who stand between the manufacturers and the working tailors, are responsible for strikes Hereafter we shall ignore the contractor and work directly for the manufacturer-We have decided to make an appropria tion from the general fund to fit up three large shops, where members of our broth erhood may work at union prices and under union rules. These shops will be under the control of the Brotherhood of Tailors:

"This system we shall extend all over the city should the contractors refuse to stand by the agreement of August, 1864. We expect to hear from them bomorrow, and when they hear of our plan I believe they will come to terms, as they will be more unclease to get our non-head when very anxious to get our mon-back when the busy senson opens in the spring." For several years past the plan outlined by Secretary Robinson has been a favorite




