STILL UNSUPPRESSED.

Cuban Insurgents Making Things How II COMES AND WHAT IT IS, Lively for Spanish Troops.

OFFICIAL ADVICES MISLEADING

While Official Reports Tell of Spanish Victories and "Fleeing Rebels," but It Is 5 Generally Believed in Havana That Rovo-Intionists Are Triumphantty Marching On Is weak, nervous

HAVANA, Dec. 31 .- There is still much gan, siternated uncertainty regarding the movements of the insurgents. According to the official report they are in full retreat, and it has even been intimated that Gomez was making for Clenfuegos, province of Santa Clara, with the intention of capturing that seaport. But an announcement made today would seem to show that Gomez is still in the vicinity of Jaguey Grande, south of Colon and in the province of Ma-

Lieutenant Colonel Perera, commanding the Navarro battalion, numbering about 850 men, was engaged with the in-surgents near Calimete, not far from Jaguey Grande, on Sunday. The fighting is said to have been very flerce, and the Spaniards are reported to have sustained the fire of a vastly superior number of in-surgents commanded by Gomez. The troops are reported to have captured the insurgent positions and to have obliged the enemy to divide his forces. The insurgents are said to have lost heavily, while on the government side only one offleer and five soldiers were killed and sixty wounded.

About an hour after this engagement the sound of cannonading was heard in the direction of the Marie plantation, about three miles from Callmete, and it is supposed that Gomez has been engaged with the Spanish column commanded by

Colonel Molina. Nows has been received of movements by the insurgents which would indicate that their forces still overrun pretty much the whole province of Matanzas, and they seem to have an uninterrupted line of communication clear scross the province and into the southern part of Santa Clara to the westward of Cienfuegos. They have burned the village of Guivan, in the Clen-

fuegos district, near the coast.

Besides the serious fighting believed to have occurred near Calimete there is a force of insurgents reported to number 2,000 moving in the neighborhood of Camarioca, a town only about fifteen miles from the city of Matanzas, and north of a line between Matanzas and Cardenas, and very near the coast. The stations at Caobas and Cabazas, which are in the immediate neighborhood of Matanzas and to the south, have been burned, as well as the canciled of the Joaquin plantation. The stores in the village of Pedroso, near to Macurijes, have also been plundered. Camarioca is the farthest point north at J. which the insurgents have been reported, and Cabazas is almost on the line of the province of Havana.

It is believed that the operations that are being conducted by the insurgents in M. M. BURKE, Matanzas are much more extensive than anything yet reported would inc'

Word has just been received that General Valdez overtook the insurgent bands of Gomez and Maceo at the Marie plantation, where they were found stationed in an advantageous position. The engage-ment which followed was evidently a hot one, the insurgent cavalry making vigor ous attacks upon the flanks of the Spanish forces. The artillery fire of the Spanlards proved effective, and the official report says that the insurgents took flight in two directions, having been divided by the assault upon them. They left seven killed and many arms, and carried away many wounded.

It is reported that the Spanish forces went in pursuit of the flying insurgents Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat, and overtook them at the Caney plantation. Here the enemy made a vigorous resistance for an hour, but were finally compelled to retreat, leaving eight killed and carrying away their wounded.

troops, it is said, lost seventeen wounded.
It is further reported that an engagenent is now in progress at a point between the villages of Perico, Cuevitas and Jovelanos, between General Vandez and the insurgent forces. Cuevitas, Perleo and Jovellanos are all in the west, northwest of Colon, and are from twelve to twesty miles nearer the city of Matanzas, and that much more remote from the border of Santa Clara than is the village of Calimete, at which point the Spaniards were said to have first engaged Gomez Sunday evening.

In spite of the official report the belief is entertained here that the Spanish forces have again sustained a serious reverse, and that instead of the insurgents being repulsed and routed the Spaniards are retiring before their advance. There are manifestations of grave uneasiness in cial circles, and the belief is prevalent that the insurgents intend another extensive incursion into Matanzas province and westward towards Havana.

A Stirring Appeal from the Armenian Re-Hef Association in Which It Is Shown That the Sultan's Harsh Mensures Are Due to the Inactivity of the Powers.

Relief association gives out the following for publication on the last day of the years: "The direct information received from various parts of Armenia depicts so appalling a condition of things that words cannot possibly convey an idea of it. The people of the west may possibly approach in imagination what the sufferings mube of people who were living in compara-tive peace in cities like Harpoot, Diarbekin Sivas and Gurun, and upon whom casuddenly the unheard of calamity of massiere initiated and consummated by the government that was to protect then Their men are murdered or imprisone their possessions robbed and their houses burned, and not only are they exposed to the terrors of famine, and the severe wir ter threatens to exterminate them, but even a merelful death is denied them, and the reign of terror is still upon the land arrests and tortures still continuing.

That the powers of Europe are no wed by any feeling of humanity in deal ing with the Turkish question is no more doubted, but it is impossible for up to be lieve the conscience of the English people will not be althousely shaken from its unparalleled duliness, and to honor the un-cient name of England as a defender of the right and the champion of the op-

Recent letters telling of the massacres in various cities contain heme of informa-tion that help to explain many points in lawful outbreak of so called Mohammedon fanatics. A letter from Trebizond giving

the testimony of eyo witnesses states:
"Bahri Pasha, governor of Van, started to come to Constantinople, and it was learned that he was bringing with him four of the fairest young maidens of Sassoun, who had been spared in the massa-cre, to make an acceptable present of them. to his sultan. This aroused the Armenian people of Trebizond to a frenzy, and it was impossible to restrain the young men the more daring of whom, as the newspaper dispatches have already informed you, fired upon Bahri Pasha when he was going about the city, with the result of wounding him. After he was cured, as is known, he carried out his infernal mission to Constantinople, and was honored with the highest decoration and appointed governor of Adana, in spite of the nervoless protest of the ambassadors.

"Afterward the pashs of Trebizond, calling twelve of the leading men of the city, demanded that they should hand over the young men who attacked the governor, and gave them just a few hours in which to carry out his order. But the chiefs of the people did not go to them until the next day, and then only answered him that the government could find out and arrest the offenders.

The Armenians, not suspecting anything, went as usual to the stores in the market, but the pasha had already begun to communicate with the sultan by tele-graph, and calling the commanders of the soldiers ordered them to be ready at a stated hour. When the mails had arrived and the people went towards the postoffice the trumpet was sound.d three times and both the soldiers and the mob rushed upon them. It is impossible to describe the horror of the scene—the roar of the murderers like that of wild beasts, the shricks deres like that of white description whose arms their husbands and sons were torn and murdered before their eyes, and universal turnult added to the sighs and grouns of the dying. And this we know is only one and not even the most terrible of the massners over all Turkey.


