TERRIBLE EXPERIENCE.

Seven Sailors Meet Death on a Rocky Bluff.

WRECK OF THE JEANNETTE COWAN.

The Big Four Masted English Ship Went Ashore on Vansouver Island, Known as the Boneyard of the Pacific-Survivors Rescued by the Tug Tyee.

SEATTLE, Wash., Jan. 13.—Ten days of suffering from cold and privation on a rocky bluff, during which time seven of the crew, including the captain and mate, met their death, and the other mate and met their death, and the other mate and seamen met with with terrible accidents, tells the tale of the wrecking of the big four masted English ship Jennette Cowan on Vancouver Island, otherwise known as the Bone Yard of the Pacific occan. The news was brought to this city yesterday by the tng Tyee, which had but a few hours before landed fourteen men bers of the crew at Port Townsend.

The tng Tyee sighted the wreck on Sat-

The tug Tyee sighted the wreck on Sat-urday afternoon. The sea was running pretty high at the time the tug hove to. A portion of the crew could be seen on an of a high bluff, on which a tent had been pitched. A sight met the gaze of the res-quers that will not be forgotten for years to come.

Scated about the fire were thirteen men, all wearing an expression of utter hope-lessness and misery. First mate Charles Legall, who was lashed to a boatswains chair, suffering from a fractured leg, told Mate Hall of the Type, the story of the dis-aster. He said the Cowan came from Cape-town, South Africa for Royal Reads B. town, South Africa, for Royal Roads, B. C., and was 108 days out when she reached Cape Flattery on Dec. 19. There was a terrible storm off the cape and the vessel stood off the cape two days before trying to come in. Then she was driven quickly to the northward by a strong southwest wind and sought shelter in the treacherous waters of Barciny sound to avoid before two as a second south of the cape. ing driven ashore on some more exposed

The sound afforded but little shelter, and she was driven on the rocks at high tide. This was 20 clock on the morning of Dec. 31, and a snow storm was coming on. The ship seemed to be breaking in two, and it was decided to leave her at once, and with the aid of a line made fast

ashore the entire erew was taken off.

Captain Thompson died three days before the arrival of the Tyee, and the cook and an able seaman and the man who ran the donkey engine died the following day, the latter becoming violently insane. The second mate and two apprentice boys met their death while trying to make land in a small boat the night the ship struck.

The survivors of the wreeked vessel are: Mate Legall and seamen Hunt, Moran, Smithe, Olson, Kerr, Cox, Chamberlain, Chamberliss, Cousin, Heats, Rosano, Carpenter and Wilson.

Testimony was adduced which tended to show that the husband had suspected his wife of improper conduct with Parker, and that he had said he would never believe in her innocence till Parker was dead.




