ENGLAND AND VENEZUELA.

The British Sahl to be Fortifying the Disputed Territory.

CARACAS, Venezuela, Jan. 23,-Michael McTurk, the head magistrate of British Gulana, who has been identified for years with the usurpation of Venezuelan terri-tory, has been relieved of his magisterial duties in order that he may command an expedition charged with fortifying the en-

tire length of the Cuyuni river lying in the disputed cerritory. This news has caused a great stir here. El Liberal, in a leading editorial, calls the attention of the government to the military preparations on the Guiana fron-tier, which, although London denies it, are actively going forward. On the Brit-is' island of Trinidad the forts are being

repaired and the militia is being drilled in the method of handling the new heavy In the name of the people of Venezula

this government is asked to fortify Ama-curo, Cangrejos and Cuyuni, on the frontior, in order to be ready for war if arbi-tration fails. The moral strength of increasing the military strength would be to unite the country, it is argued, and command the respect of President Crespo's bitterest enemies. 


