THE WARFARE IN CUBA. Reports Carefully Revised by Many People Complain of Be-Spanish Officials.

EXAGGERATED TALES OF VIOTORY.

By No Means Sick, But They Don't Feel While Admitting That the Insurgents Fought Bravely, the Spaniards Send Out Reports of a Six Hour Battle in Which Are Weak, Nervous, Tire Easily and Only Six Spanlards Were Killed.

HAVANA, Feb. 13 .- A dispatch received here from Santa Clara, capital of the prov-ince of that name, from General Oliver, the Spanish commander in that district, announces a serious defeat of the insurgents under Serafin Sanchez and Mirabel. two of the most important insurgent lead-ers outside of the province of Havana. The engagement took place between Camaju-

It was not until 5 o'clock in the after-noon that flring enased, and fatigue parties were sent out to gather up the insurgent dead and wounded, while the Spanish cavalry pursued the retreating bodies of the enemy. The soldiers found forty-eight dead insurgents on the field, and it was ostimated by fairly accurate count that

ostimated by fairly accurate count that the enemy carried away UD wounded. The loss sustained by the troops was slight in view of the fact that the fighting insteed over six hours. The troops lost Major Tomes, Sergeant Otero and four soldiers killed, and had a lieutenant, one sergeant and five soldiers wounded. General Others has complimented Col-

General Oliver has complimented Col-onel Lopez upon the admirable manner in which he has relieved Camajuani. The troops, when last heard from, were occutroops, when last heard from, were occu-pying that place, and no danger was ap-prehended of any further movement of the insurgents upon the town, which, by the way, is not far from Santa Clara. The insurgents in this province on Tues-day made a daring attack upon a body of forty recently mobilized troops who were on their way from San Nicolas to Havana. The insurgents were under the leadership of Perez and Martinez, but were com-pelled to retreat when a detachment of the

pelled to retreat when a detachment of the battalion of volunteers of the neighborhood was sent against them. Near Itaba the insurgents have attacked

a train escorted by volunteers of the Cu-enca battalion and a few regular soldiers. The insurgents were beaten off with a loss of five killed and a quantity of arms and ammunition. They retired with their wounded. Five soldiers were wounded

during the engagement. A column of troops commanded by Gen-sral Prats has had two skirmishes with the insurgents in the vicinity of Jesus Maria, province of Matanzas. During the first exchange of shots the insurgents lost four killed and retreated. They were pur-sued and overtaken, when the second skirmish took place with the result that the insurgents lost fifteen killed and, in addtion, the troops captured six priseners and a number of rifles. Only one Spanish sol-dier was killed during the two skirmishes, although several were wounded.

The Coroner's Jury So Decides in the Pearl Bryan Case.

HER THROAT OUT WHILE ALIVE.

Sackson and Walling Will be Taken to Kentucky for Trial-Telltale Bushes Where the Terrible Crime Was Committed-The Victim Drugged with Cocaine,

CINCINNATI, Feb. 13 .- The verdict of the coronar's jury in the Pearl Bryan murder case, returned yesterday afternoon, de-clares that "cocaine had been administered for purposes unknown," and that "decapitation was performed, at the point where the body was found, while there was life in the body. That Miss Pearl Bryan, Jackson and Walling were last seen together on the evening of Friday, Jan. 31, in Cincinnati, where they took a cab and drove

westward." The striking points made in the verdict are that Pearl Bryan had been drugged with cocaine and that she was murdered where the body was found. The evidence as to cocaine was by Dr. W. H. Crane, of Cincinnati, whe has not yet quite com-plated an analysis of Miss Bryan's stomach contents. He testified that he had found a quarter of a grain of cocaine, and thought he would find more. He had also found traces of arsenic and mercury, but these

were in the embalming finid. As to decapitation at the place where the body was found the testimony of the bushes was introduced. Twigs and leaves cut from these bushes the morning the body was found showed blood stains on the lower side at the heights of from two to six feet from the ground. One witness testified that he found footprints by a woman's shoe under an apple tree near where the body lay.

Where the body lay. Dr. Caruthers gave the opinion before the jury that the decapitation was per-formed where the body was found while there was still life in the body. It was done with a sharp knife, or more probably with a sharp knife, or more probably

with a surgeon's scalpel. This latter testimony has an important bearing on the jurisdiction over the pris-oners. There is little doubt now that in less than twenty-four hours the prisoners will be indicated by the Campbell county grand jury, and will possibly be removed from Ohio to Kentucky for trial. What effect this will have upon the prisoners' disposition to tell the whole truth about the murder is difficult to predict.
