From the advance sheets of Mine Inspector Stein's report of the Fifth anthracite district, the following statistics are gleaned: For 1895 there were 50 fatal and 85 non-fatal accidents out of 19,981 employees; average number of employees to each casualty was 199; number of tons of coal mined to each fatal casualty, 124,828; number of tons to each non-fatal accident, 84,292. Ratio of tons of coal to each accident, fatal and non-fatal, 121,350. Number of tons mined to each employee, 359; total number of tons of coal mined, 144,895.
