



GOVERNMENT ON THE AGGRESSIVE.

Loyal Soldiers Make an Advance Upon the Revolutionists and Capture a Town. Granada Loyal to the President, and Masaya Will Doubtiess Follow Sult.

MANAGUA, Nienragua, Feb. 28.-The revolution is now in full blast, and all the cities of Nicaragua on this side of the country are in arms and preparing either to support President Zelaya or to contribute men for the march of his enemies upon the capital, Managua.

The government forces have commenced an advance upon the departments in rean invance upon the departments in re-volt, without standing on the defensive and waiting for the expected attack of the Leonists. The town of Nanarote was at-tacked and taken by storm by the govern-ment troops yesterday. The moral effect of its capture is bound to be great, and it is regarded as a most important victory for the avcornment. for the government.

Fugilities who have reached this city from Leon, the old capital of Nicaragua, headquarters of the rebels, which is opposed to the Zelaya party on general prin-ciples, and as a result of differences of long standing, chief of which is the transfer of the capital from Leon to Managua, say that the Leonists are in arms to a man and rapidly reorganizing an army with which to advance upon Managua. They have the advantage of possessing more modern arms and artillery, but the adherents of the president are not dis-couraged, especially as the Granada conservatives, concerning whose attitude as a body there was some doubt, declared them-selves yesterday in favor of Zelaya.

This means almost half the battle won, or Masaya will undoubtedly follow the lead of Granada. The latter city has more important commercial interests than any other city of Nicaragua. Besides, it is the eastern port of Lake Nicaragua and the stopping place of the steamers which cross the lake to Fort San Carlos at the mouth of the San Juan river, by which watermark of the San Juan river, by which waterway communication with the Atlantic ocean is maintained, via San Juan dei Sur, better known as Greytown, near the eastern en-trance to the proposed maritime canal of Nicaragua. Then, again, the support of the Con-servatives of Granada, who are in the ma-jority by long odds, is not lukewarm sup-port. They telegraphed to the president yesterday offering him the sum of \$1,009,-000 with which to equip the troops being hurriedly enrolled to defend the capital against the Leonists and their clerical supporters. The offer was promptly accepted.

The millitary authorities here are work-ing night and day, and the populace is wild with warlike enthusiasm. The mill-tary band which on certain nights in the week plays in front of the president's pal-ace now plays there nightly, and all the patriotic airs are loudly applauded by the crowds which gather about the executive compelled to appear three or four times in answer to the demands of his admiring supporters.

The soldiers of Nicaragua go barefooted, are dressed in jean jumpers and pants and a straw has, and rifle, bayonet and cartridge belt completes their equipment. Consequently the expense of putting a few thousand men in the field is not very great, so long as the government can ob-tain arms. The cost of feeding a Niearaguan army is also very light.



THE VOTE NEARLY UNANIMOUS.

Only One Vote Dissents from Captain Ledyard's Resolution Removing the Churlish Englishman's Name from the List of Honorary Members,

NEW YOUR, Feb. 28.-The club house of the New York Yacht club was absolutely packed last night with yachtsmen and yacht owners who were anxious to testify by their presence that the Dunraven-Do-fender case should be estilled once and for all. Up to the time of meeting no direct apology or notification of intended re-signation bud been received by any club ufficer from Lord Dunraven. It was ru-mored that a letter embodying a resignation was on its way from the doubly de-feated owner of Valkyrie, but it was not in evidence when the meeting was called to order by Commodore Brown.

As soon as the meeting was called to order by Commolore E. M. Brown, Cap-tain Lewis Cass Ledyard requested that his metion, calling for the resignation of Lord Dunraven from the New York Yacht club; which he proposed two weeks ago



tonb DUNHAVES. should be withdrawn. The request was granted unanimously. Coptain Ledyard then claimed that under chapter 21 of the bylaws of the club Lord Dunraven's actions should be summarily dealt with. This by law mads as follows:

"In case of an occurrence injurious to the welfare of the club, the name or names of any member or members implicated therein may be removed from the list of members by a vote of the majority of the yachts represented at any general or special meeting."

Captain Lodyard then offered a pream-ble and resolutions, which are in substance as follows:

"The Earl of Dunraven, an honorary member of this club, has publicly charged foul play on the part of the Defender, in the recent races for the America's cup, of such a nature as necessarily implicate the managing owners of the vessel.

"The charge has been investigated by a commission of the highest character, which has proceeded judicially, and before which Lord Dunraven has appeared and given his own and other testimony, and has been heard in person and by counsel. The com-mission has unanimously decided that the charge was fulse; that it was not merely unproved, but was affirmatively disproved by competent and uncontradictory evi-dence, leaving no possibility of doubt, "The commission has also found that the facts upon which Lord Dunraven acted, according to his own statement, furnished

ne justification for making such a change. "It further appears that in print and in public speech Lord Dunraven has sought to justify the making of the charge by numerous misrepresentations of fact. He has been forced himself to admit the untruth of most of these, yet he stubbornly refuses to retract the injurious inferences drawn






