THE WAR IN NICARAGUA.

The Revolt Against President Zelaya Now in Full Blast.

GOVERNMENT ON THE AGGRESSIVE.

Loyal Soldiers Make an Advance Upon the Revolutionists and Capture a Town. Granada Loyal to the President, and Masaya Will Doubtless Follow Suit.

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Feb. 28.—The revolution is now in full blast, and all the cities of Nicaragua on this side of the country are in arms and preparing either to support President Zelaya or to contribute men for the march of his enemies upon the capital, Managua.

The government forces have commenced an advance upon the departments in revolt, without standing on the defensive and waiting for the expected attack of the Leonists.

Fugitives who have reached this city from Leon, the old capital of Nicaragua, headquarters of the rebels, which is opposed to the Zelaya party on general principles, and as a result of differences of long standing, chief of which is the transfer of the capital from Leon to Managua, say that the Leonists are in arms to a man and rapidly reorganizing an army with which to advance upon Managua.

This means almost half the battle won, for Masaya will undoubtedly follow the lead of Granada. The latter city has more important commercial interests than any other city of Nicaragua.

Then, again, the support of the Conservatives of Granada, who are in the majority by long odds, is not lukewarm support. They telegraphed to the president yesterday offering him the sum of \$1,000,000 with which to equip the troops being hurriedly enrolled to defend the capital against the Leonists and their clerical supporters.

The military authorities here are working night and day, and the populace is wild with warlike enthusiasm. The military band which on certain nights in the week plays in front of the president's mansion is loudly applauded by the crowds which gather about the executive mansion.

The soldiers of Nicaragua go barefooted, are dressed in jean jumpers and pants and a straw hat, and rifle, bayonet and cartridge belt completes their outfit.

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DUNRAVEN DISGRACED.

The Alleged Yachtsman Expelled from New York's Yacht Club.

THE VOTE NEARLY UNANIMOUS.

Only One Vote Dissents from Captain Ledyard's Resolution Removing the Churchill Englishman's Name from the List of Honorary Members.

NEW YORK, Feb. 28.—The club house of the New York Yacht club was absolutely packed last night with yachtsmen and yacht owners who were anxious to testify by their presence that the Dunraven-Defender case should be settled, once and for all.

As soon as the meeting was called to order by Commodore Brown, the resolution removing the name of the Churchills from the list of honorary members was adopted by a vote of 100 to 1.



Lord Dunraven. The request was granted unanimously. Captain Ledyard then claimed that under chapter 21 of the by-laws of the club Lord Dunraven's actions should be summarily dealt with.

"In case of an occurrence injurious to the welfare of the club, the name or names of any member or members implicated therein may be removed from the list of members by a vote of the majority of the yachts represented at any general or special meeting."

Captain Ledyard then offered a preamble and resolutions, which are in substance as follows: "The Earl of Dunraven, an honorary member of this club, has publicly charged foul play on the part of the Defender, in the recent races for the America's cup, of such a nature as necessarily implicate the managing owners of the vessel."

"The charge has been investigated by a commission of the highest character, which has proceeded judicially, and before which Lord Dunraven has appeared and given his own and other testimony, and has been heard in person and by counsel. The commission has unanimously decided that the charge was false; that it was not merely unproved, but was affirmatively disproved by competent and uncontradictory evidence, leaving no possibility of doubt."

"The commission has also found that the facts upon which Lord Dunraven acted, according to his own statement, furnished no justification for making such a charge, and further appears that in print and in public speech Lord Dunraven has sought to justify the making of the charge by numerous misrepresentations of fact. He has been forced himself to admit the untruth of most of these, yet he stubbornly refuses to retract the injurious inferences drawn from them."

"The representatives of this club engaged in the international yacht races with Lord Dunraven, as the representative of English yachtsmen, upon the footing of mutual confidence and honor. He has required their courtesy and confidence by distrust, suspicion, unfounded imputations of fraud and a refusal of reparation. By his course he has forfeited the high esteem which led to his election as an honorary member of this club."

"Therefore be it resolved, that the privileges of honorary membership heretofore extended to the Earl of Dunraven are hereby withdrawn, and that his name be removed from the list of honorary members of the club."

In introducing the resolution Rear Commodore Ledyard said: "Lord Dunraven is still carping, still hedging, still evading and still insisting that he saw with his eyes what we know he never did see, as has been conclusively proved. I think that this course has been such that it is due to the dignity and self-respect of this club that action shall be taken which will leave no room for doubt as to the attitude of the club."

When Mr. Ledyard had done speaking he was greeted with wild cheers and cries of "bravo," "bravo." As soon as quiet was restored Commodore Brown put the resolution to the forty yacht owners present, all of whom, but one, answering in the affirmative. The only dissenting vote was cast by Chester E. Monroe, owner of the sloop yacht Orva.

When the result was announced the yells of the club members could be heard blocks away, and when it was understood that Dunraven's name was no longer on the roll of the club every member, with the one noted exception, expressed himself as being perfectly satisfied that the rule of the majority was in every way right and deserved.

Rear Commodore James D. Smith, in reply to the query of a representative of the Associated Press, said: "What do I think of it? Why, it is the most just and satisfactory decision that was ever arrived at by any yacht club in the world against a man who had violated the honorable rules of sport, the honor and integrity of men his peers."
