Resolved, That we, citizens of this great Republic and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in meeting assembled, do now demand the immediate restoration to liberty of all men incarcerated in British prisons for offenses against British domination in Ireland; that we believe that these prisoners are entitled to such liberty by the usage and customs of nations.

Resolved, That we urge upon our Government the necessity of taking immediate steps to secure the release of these American citizens and of interesting itself, for the sake of international decency and common humanity, in behalf of their fellow-prisoners. Be it, furthermore.

Resolved, That copies of these resolutions be sent to the President of the United States, to the members of the Cabinet, to the members of Congress and be published in the SHENANDOAH EVENING HERALD.

THE BOROUGHS REQUIRES.

The Governor Will Issue Commissions to Messrs. Lawlor and Cardin.

HARRISBURG, March 5.—Governor Hastings, acting under the advice of Attorney General McCormick, has appointed Martin J. Lawlor and John J. Cardin to be Justices of the Peace in Shenandoah, and Jonathan Jones and Philip E. Coyle to Mahanoy City, and their commissions will be issued.

The fact that the Governor has taken the action he did, is pretty good evidence that their election is considered regular and that the two boroughs are entitled to but two Justices.

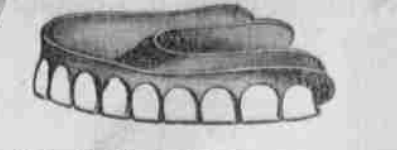
