Premier Crispi's Resignation Accepted by the King.

DISORDER THROUGHOUT ITALY.

State of Public Sentiment Against the Government-It Is Believed Rudini Will Succeed Crispi.

chamber of daputies yesterday Premier Crispl announced that King Humbert had accepted the resignations of the entire ministry, but that they would remain at their posts until their successors were ap-pointed. The announcement was followed by loud cheers, which were heard by the crowds cutside and, being understood, were taken up and echoed far and wide. There were many shouts of disapproval at the announcement that the ministry would not retire at once. After the auno ments both houses speedlly adjourned

Many members of the chamber of depu-ties were prepared to make inflammatory speeches, and there is much complaint among them, growing out of their disappointment on this score, at the abrupt and summary manner in which an adjournment was had. The government seems to have taken the chamber by surprise by this movement. Even the Marquis di Ru-dini, the ex-promier, the leader of the op-position, and who, it is generally believed. has been asked by King Humbert to form a new cabinet, desired to be heard by the chamber, and was unceremonlously cut

The party of the Left had even given notice of a motion to impeach the cabinet, and are in a high state of indignation at leaving the present ministry in undis-

leaving the present ministry in undisputed control pending the formation of the new government.

After the sitting had been adjourned and the wrangiling which subsequently broke out among the deputies in the loblies had come to an end, 150 of the deputies held a meeting at which Signor Villa, president of the chamber of deputies, explained that they were actuated in thus adjourning and cutting off debate by adesire to avert untoward incidents which might further imperil the welfare of the country. As it was, the deputies had oxpressed the indignation of the country with the policy of the government, and, as assurances were given of a change of ministry, this was thought sufficient.
