THE INSURGENTS BUSY.

General Weyler Seems Still Unable to "Hem Them In." MOVE ABOUT AS THEY PLEASE.

HAVANA, March 12.—The insurgents have fired upon a train escorted by troops in the vicinity of Guanajay, province of Pinar del Rio.

The lighthouse of San Antonio has recently been extinguished several times and in future it will be garrisoned by troops.

A dispatch from Matanzas says that a mixed train between Guanajay and Manguito has been captured by a numerous band of insurgents.

Spain Preparing for Possible War. MADRID, March 12.—There are manifest signs that the government continues its preparation in the event of a serious development of its difficulty with the United States.

General Garcia Indicted. NEW YORK, March 12.—General Calixto Garcia, Captain Samuel Hughes, John D. Hart, Captain John Brabazon, Bernardo J. Buzo and Benjamin J. Guerra, of the Bermuda expedition, were yesterday indicted by the federal grand jury for taking part in an armed expedition, contrary to the neutrality laws.

Chicago Bucket Shop Prosecutions. CHICAGO, March 12.—The preliminary hearing of the cases against the bucket shop operators, who were recently indicted wholesale by the grand jury, came up before Judge Horton yesterday.

Accused Bank President Acquitted. SAN FRANCISCO, March 12.—R. H. McDonald, Jr., president of the defunct Pacific bank, was yesterday acquitted of falsifying the records of the concern.

Death of a Prominent Minister. PITTSBURG, Pa., March 12.—Rev. T. E. Colburn, corresponding secretary of the Foreign Missions of the Methodist Protestant church, died suddenly yesterday at the home of Rev. R. S. Halsart.

Fatal Disobedience of Orders. WILLIAMSBURG, Pa., March 12.—Two freight trains collided on the Northern Central railroad about thirty miles from here.

An Exploding Boiler Kills Twelve. BRUSSELS, March 12.—A boiler explosion in a steel foundry near Athus, in southern Belgium, twelve persons were killed and many injured.

STILL TALKING OF CUBA

Senators in No Hurry to Pass the Recognition Resolutions.

MR. HOAR'S APPEAL TO SHERMAN.

He Urges the Ohio Statesman Not to Mar His Brilliant Public Record by a Suicidal Interference with the Rights of a Friendly Power.

WASHINGTON, March 12.—The Cuban debate in the senate has advanced to the stage of one of the greatest debates of the American congress, and the speech yesterday of Senator Hoar, the venerable senator from Massachusetts, was another eventful feature of the discussion.

In the main the speech was a plea for calm, dignified and judicial action, instead of the excitement and disorder of the mob and the impassioned speech of orators. Mr. Hoar characterized his colleague, Mr. Sherman, as one of the greatest statesmen of the country, whose name would go down in history along with that of Lincoln, Grant, Seward, Fish and his illustrious brother, and he besought the Ohio senator not to obliterate this brilliant record by hasty and unguarded action on the Cuban question.

Mr. Hoar's resolution for postponement lost its parliamentary status at 2 o'clock and went to the calendar, Mr. Sherman announcing that from this time forward he would press the privileged question—the conference report accepting the house Cuban resolutions.

Mr. Tupper closed his speech in opposition to the claim of Mr. Dupont for a seat in the senate, and Mr. Pritchard, of North Carolina, secured the floor for a speech today in support of the claim of Mr. Dupont. The house passed the postoffice appropriation bill which has been under consideration since last Friday.

Corbett Signs the Articles. PITTSBURG, March 12.—The original articles of agreement for a fight between James J. Corbett and Robert Fitzsimmons, forwarded by the Holbrook club, of London, were received here last evening and attached his signature without hesitancy. He agrees to every condition stipulated, and fills in the blank regarding division of the purse with the words: "Winner to take all." He leaves the date in June, 1896, open for the club and Fitzsimmons to settle upon.

The Powell Murder Mystery. NEW YORK, March 12.—The inquiry into the death of Stephen Powell, who was murdered Saturday night near his home at Hempstead, L. I., was begun last night. So little light could be thrown upon the case that the inquiry went over for one week. At present two or three suspects are in jail, but little of a tangible form has yet been discovered to connect them with the crime. The rewards now offered for the conviction of the murderer amount to \$4,000.

Minnie Swanger Pleads Guilty. HOLLIDAYSBURG, Pa., March 12.—Minnie Swanger, the 12-year-old Altoona murderer, pleaded guilty to murder in the second degree yesterday. District Attorney Hammond accepted the plea. The child's crime was the murder of her uncle, William McGregor, by mixing poison with his coffee. Her grandmother also drank the poisoned coffee. Judge Bell said that he would send the prisoner to a house of correction.

Great Interest in the Fate of Cassala. LONDON, March 12.—Great interest is felt here in the fate of Cassala. Two large Turkish forces, one under Osman Digma, are advancing. A disaster to the Italian garrison would produce a revival of the Mahdist activity all along the Sudan frontier, especially about Suakin and Tokar. The native tribes there, who are now friendly, would be compelled from self-protection to join the victorious Khalifa.

Tennessee's Governor Seriously Ill. NASHVILLE, March 12.—Governor Turney was forced to go to his home at Winchester on Tuesday because of serious illness resulting from rheumatism. Advice from Winchester today report him no better. He is a great sufferer from this disease, and this severe attack has greatly alarmed those acquainted with his condition.

Your Fell with a Freight Elevator. MEMPHIS, March 12.—A freight elevator in the saddlery and carriage house of W. S. Bruce & Sons fell sixty feet yesterday by the cable breaking. Four men on it were injured, one fatally. They are: Frank Heale, both legs broken, many ribs; Andy Bowen, ankle broken; Gust Chany, hip broken; Sam Bell, internal injuries.
