Fees of Constables.

County Solicitor Ulrich yesterday gave an opinion to the County Commissioners on the question of fees of constables. In it he says all constables elected at the last election must be paid under the fee bill of May 23, ISB3; that constables cannot receive pay for making returns to court, attending general elections or special, township or ward and borough elections. For making an arrest constables are entitled to \$1.00, which is paid when the case is finally dispessed of. Prison wardens dare not pay it, nor pay mileage. For executing a warrant for the Commonwealth, he is entitled to \$1.00, no matter what the number of defendants. For serving subpoenas he is cutified to 50 cents, no matter how many names it contains. For serving an attachment he is entitled to the pay of a sheriff's officer.

Radziewicz Won-

The case of Isaac Levy, of New York, against Charles Radziewicz, of town, was arbitrated at Pottsville yesterday and resulted in a victory for Mr. Radziewicz, Levy sued to recover \$73 for nine thousand paper butter boxes which Radziewicz claimed be never ordered. The arbitrators gave an award to Radziewicz and directed that Levy pay the costs, which amounted to as much as pay the costs, which amounted to as much as the claim. H. W.
