CARLISLE'S CANDIDACY

Cleveland's Successor.

IT WILL SOON BE ANNOUNCED.

He Will Go Before the Convention as the Representative of the "Sound Money" Views of the Administration .- The Secre-

tary's Roply to Crisp's Critiniam.

WASHINGTON, March 17 .- Secretary Carlisle is a candidate for the presidential nomination at Chicago, and a public an-nouncement to that effect will soon be noncement to that effect will soon be made by one of the secretary's close friends in the senate. This announcement, however, will not be made until President Cleveland has formally stated his purpose not to permit his name to be used in the convention in connection with a third term. It is learned on excellent authority that the president has fully decided upon this course and it is expected that he will make known his determination within a

Although Secretary Olney's name has been considered with favor by Democratic londers, it is known that he does not de-sire the nomination. It is undoubtedly true that Mr. Carlisle's candidacy will have the support of Mr. Cleveland and the members of the cabinet. He will go before the con-vention as the representative of the "sound money" views of the administration. His friends, in conducting the canvass for Mr. Carlisle's nomination, will urge that it be made upon a sound money platform, and, if he be successful at Chicago, will then make this issue prominent in the cam-paign leading up to the November elec-

P. of its affairs the legal tender gold and silver coins of the United States have been treated precisely alike, except that greater efforts have been made to keep silver coin

efforts have been made to keep silver con-in circulation than have been made to keep gold coin in circulation. "The amount paid out by the depart-ment in silver coins and silver certificates greatly exceeds the amount paid out in gold coins and gold certificates, and in no instance has the least discrimination been made against silver or its paper repro-sentative. When United States notes or treasury notes are presented for redemp-tion gold is paid if it is demanded, and if silver is demanded silver is paid. Thus the coins of the two metals are treated exactly allke in making payments by the government, as well as in the discharge of debts due to the government.

"It has always been the policy of the treasury department to encourage the use of silver to the largest possible extent, and in order to accomplish this standard silver dollars will be sent by expresses at the ex-pense of the government' to any one who will deposit an equivalent amount in silver certificates or in treasury notes of 1800 with the United States treasurer or any assistant treasurer or with a national bank depository.

"In August, 1893, there was a great and unusual domand in nearly every part of the country for currency of small denom-inations, and in its attempts to supply this demand the treasury department paid out, in defraying the expenses of the govern-ment and in exchange for other forms of currency, all the silver lawfully used for these purposes, so that for a short time it was compelled to suspend payment in standard silver dollars except in the redemption of allver certificates and treasury notes of 1890.

"My letter to the United States senate, upon which Mr. Crisp's statement seems to have been based, was written on the 17th day of August, 1893, and at that time there was no free silver in the treasury that is, there were no standard silver dollars in the treasury except such as the law rodert





The Brutal Treatment of Dr. Dalgado, an American Citizen.

WEYLER PROMISES SATISFACTION.

Minister Dupuy Do Lonio Gives the Spanish Side of the Cuban Question in a Statement to Secretary Olney, Which Is Read In the Senate by Senator Morgan.

HAVANA, March 17,-Dr. Joso Manuel Delgado, the American citizen who is re-ported to have been shot and nearly killed by Spanish troops under the command of General Melquiz, has arrived here. He is so seriously injured that he had to be earfiel on a stretcher. The captain gen-eral has promised the promptost inquiry into the circumstances in the case, and has given assurances that the guilty per sons will be most severely punished. The circumstances in the case, so far as

The uncumstances in the case, so that they can be gathered at present, seem to pollution a most gross and deliberate out-rage upon the part of the Spanish sol-diery, who were made aware that Mr. Delgado and his aged father were both American citizens Int this fact appears to have had no weight with the Spanish officers, and Dr. Delgado was said to have been bound and shot without trial and without any justification. The doctor was left for dead, and eight of his fudier's em-ployes were killed.

The United States consul general, Mr. The United States consul general, Mr. Ramon O. Williams, has taken the mat-ter in hand, and no stone will be left un-turned to bring the Spanlards to justice. Captain General Weyler has ordered a therough investigation to be made into the disaster at Cano seven unlike from the disaster at Cano, seven miles from here, by which twolve addiers belonging to the San Quintan battallon wore killed. and a captain, four lieutenants and twen-ty-seven soldiers belonging to the same corps were wounded by the Spanish gar-rison of that town, who mistook the Span-lards for a band of insurgents that had previously attacked the place and been repulsed.

repulsed. The insurgents have burned the fields, wharf and sugar depot of Defores. In the Remodies district of the province of Santa Chrs, and they have also destroyed by fire the fields and splendid buildings of the Laberinto plantation. The insurgent brigadier, Perquito Peroz, died recently in the vicinity of Binabas. In the Remedies district, in which neighbor-head seven countrymen were recently

hood seven countrymen were recently hanged for supplying vegetables to detachments of Spanish troops. While passing through the Batabano

district the insurgents plundered a num-ber of houses and stores and reduced a town to ashes. All the documents belonging to the municipality and the Spanish were burned.

MINISTER DE LOME'S STATEMENT. The Spanish Minister's Argument Against Cuban Recognition.

WASHINGTON, March 17.-The statement of the Spanish side of the Cuban question as made by Senor Dupuy de Lonie, the Spanish minister, furnished by the secretary of state to the senate committee on foreign relations and to which considerable reference has been made on the debate on Cuba was yesterday read in the senate

saying that it is not of great importance. "If." he says, "the crop should be entirely lost and the average exportation of 600,000 tons were absolutely impossible the loss to the treasury would be \$450,000. This is less than 1 per cent. of the war expenses." Continuing, he says the insurgents do not occupy any part of the country per-manently, and that, as they are well mounted, it is easy for them to outmarch the troops. Their tactics, he says, are not to engage in fight, but to attack the small towns, garrisoned only by very small forces of militia. If there are more than forces of milita. If there are more than twenty soldiers they never approach the blockhouses. Only when their forces greatly outnumber those of the army do a part of them stand to fight.

Senor De Lome says that, considering only the final result of the war, the condition has been improved by the raid of the two Cuban leaders, Maximo Gomez and Maceo. The advance to the vicinity of





"Peace can only be at-tained by the constant persecution of the bands, by preventing them from estab-lishing themselves in a part of the country by lessening their number by constant engagements and by discouraging them, diminishing their resources and by proving to them that the greater and better part of the country not only is not with

them, but against them. "The object of the insurgents in destroying property, which it is stated is the only harm they have inflicted, is to punish the land owners for their support of the Spanish government and to drive the laborers to their ranks. Spain wants peace, free-

dom and civilization in the island." Minister De Lome, calls attention to the fact that the insurgents have no estab-lished seat of government, and says their constitution was adopted only for the purpose of getting it printed in the New York popers. He says the movements of this proops are directed largely by the New York junta, composed of eltizens of the United States. He says that everything is planned in this country and South America, and that the leaders are mostly for-eignors or colored men aided by home demagogues and a few enthusiasts. He doclares they would not be able to form a

government if separated from Spain. In conclusion the minister says: "It is the optimion of everybody that in a very short time the main body of the insur-gents, which is in a critical condition, will be dealt with, but that if an increase of the Spanish army in Cubu is nonceasary it can be supplied from Spain." *
