

Opposing the Government's African Campaign in Farliament. ALL DERVISHES GALLED TO ARMS.

ENEASINESS IN ENGLAND

To Add to Great Britam's Embarrassment Premier Budini Is Meeting with Defer-

mined Opposition in the Italian Chamher of Deputies.

LONDON, March 21 .- The government gives evidence that considerable measi-ness is feit regarding the development of the military situation in Africa. The ag-gressive movement of Caman Digna is a special source of anglety to the Heitish government. A conforence was held to-day between Lord Wolseley, General Sir day between Lord Wolseley, General Sir Redvers Bullers, adjutant general; Gene-ral Sir Evalyn Wood, quartermaster gen-eral, and Sir Francis Grenfell, Inspector general of mixillary forces and of recercit-ing, regarding the defense of Stuckin. Preparations have been made for the dis-patch of British teoops in an emergency. Several tons of material were left at Wool-wich for Egypt yesterday. It is reported that when Akasheh is oc-eupied, Amara will also be eccupied as an advance post.

A dispatch from Cairo to The Globe says: The khalifa has proclaimed a holy war against Egypt, calling upon all der vishes capable of bearing arms to curoll themselves under the green banner. It is asserted that Osman Digna will quit Cassala and join the dervish forces around Dongola. Fully 6,000 dervishes are re-Dongoia. Fully 5,000 dervises are re-ported afoot and ready to fight. The mas-sacre of Italians at Adowa filled them with warlike zeal, and the fall of Cassala will inflame them with fanaticism. They may take the initiative and may fall upon the advanced column on the Nile and crush it, even before the main support can reach Assouan. This is a source of much approhension here.

In the discussion of the Nile expedition in the house of commons last evening Mr. John Dillon criticized the government for not informing France of its intentions be-forehand. He charged that the govern-ment was acting in the interest of the dreibund and was crawling at the feet of Emperor William. Mr. John Morley said that the diversion

of the funds of the Calses for the purposes of England would necessarily prolong the English occupation, and by insisting upon remaining in Egypt Great Britain admitted that Egypt was not strong enough to stand by itself. Yet, he continued, the new policy is to impose upon Egypt the duty of governing one of the most diffi-cult territories on the earth. Nothing, in his opinion, showed that the Egyptian frontier was monaced.

Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, the secretary f state for the colonies, contended that of state for the colonies, contended that all the opposition arguments were tainted with a preconceived determination to evacuate Egypt. He pointed out the ben-efits resulting to that country from the British occupation, saying that nothing in recent history was the subject for greater pride than the peaceful revolution is been Allenthorities headed a conset in Egypt. All authorities, he added, agreed that the withdrawal of the British troops would mean that all this work was to be undone. A vast majority of Englishmen were convinced that the work of Great Britain in Egypt was not completed and that it would be dishonorable to leave

Egypt until it was completed. The situation at Wady Halfa was bad, but, Mr. Chamberlain explained, it might have been borne for some years longer had it not been for the defeat of the Italians. Now, however, it was felt that if Cassala fell the effect would be incalculable upon Egyptian interests, and if Italy was again defeated many a tribe hitherto allenated from the khalifa would rejoin his forces, and he might make a great further effort to destroy Egypt and the civilization of which England was the protector. The details published do not differ materially from the reports that have already found their way to the world. The green book confirms the report that the Crispi government, before it resigned, authorized General Baldissera to send Major Salza to the Negus Menelek, to treat for peace on the most favorable terms. A dispatch to The Tribuna from Masso-wah says that Major Salsa has returned a second time from the camp of the Negus, and will go back for the third time today. No details are given of the demands made by the Abyasinians or of the terms the Italians are willing to accord for peace, though it is assurted that Monclek de-mands an indemnity of 40,000,000 lire from Italy. This condition is, of course, unac-coptable, and further complicates the sit-uation.

The sensational feature of the trial just closed was that Stuckey went on the witness stand and testified that his superiors in the bank gave him money to go away, and then sought to throw on him the blame for a shortage in the funds.

Alleged Train Wrecker Arrested. WILLIAMSPORT, Pa., March 21.-Train wreckers ditched a Pennsylvania railroad freight train at South Williamsport yes-terday morning. The engine and nine cars were demolished. The crew saved their lives by jumping.
