By the use of artillery and cavalry he disloged them, securing fifteen prisoners. The insurgents carried off many dead and wounded. The prisoners were court martialed.

The crowd then proceeded in a body to the French consulate, where deputation entered to express sentiments of friendship and esteem for France. 

French Ambassador Visits Salisbury, LONDON, March 28 .- The Standard has a dispatch from Cairo which says: There are already 6,000 troops at Wady Halfa, but there is no intention of marching upon Dongola until they have 10,000 troops. The French ambassador, Baron de Courcel, had a long interview with Lord Salis-bury at the latter's residence yesterday. The conference is aupposed to have dealt with the subject of the Nile expedition. An official visit by an aubassador on Sunday to the private residence of the prime minister or minister of foreign affairs is an unusual occurrence, and this leads to the supposition that the subject of Baron de Courcel's call was an important

Dervishes Repeatedly Routed.

MASSOWAH, March 28.—A force of 600 dervishes attacked Sabderat Pass on March 6. It was defended by eighty nativo troops, and the enemy were de-feated and field, leaving forty-one killed. The Italian loss was three killed. On March 18 1,500 dervishes renewed the attack, but they were repulsed four times with heavy loss. Three thousand derwith heavy ross. Three choisand der-vishes are still threatening the pass, and reinforcements have been dispatched from Cassala. The Negus Menclek has ordered his chiefs to meet him at Ma-kalle, where he will bid them farewell and return to Shoa.

Spain Would Reseat Interference. MADRID, March 23.—The Heraldo says: "Spain could never officially recognize a United States commission of inquiry into Cuban affairs. It is impossible that Pres-tiont Cleveland should have such an idea. War between Spain and America would be rescherable. Scain in former times has he preferable. Spain in former times has accepted the consequences of more terrible struggles than would be a war with the United States, and we should prefer to risk a war to recognizing the commission.

New York Custom House Robberles

NEW YORK, March 23 -- Collector Kilbreth has evidence that for twenty years New York importers have been systematically robbed by officials at the apprais-ers' stores, who, it is believed, have made away with hundreds of thousands of dol-lars' worth of goods. It is expected that several important arrests of government officials will be made within a few days. For years the big importers have been complaining that packages sent to the stores were rifled of part of their contents. Joseph J. Printsnulka, March 33.-Fire in the At-lantic refinery yesterday caused a loss of over \$100,000. The fire spread to the tanks, and the burning oil rushed down and spread in streams of fire over the properties. The water poured on the oil had no effect, and only served to scatter it. The fluid rushed over the tracks of the Al-legheny Valley railroad and blocked all traffic. The telegraph and telephone wires and poles near the refinery were burned down from the intense heat. Altogether 125,000 barrels of oll were destroyed, most of it refined.
