Another Battle Batween Allies on a Cuban Plantation.

NINETESN KILLED MANY WOUNDED

As a Result of the Mistake a Court Martial Has Been Ordered-Details of the Destruction of San Autumo Las Vegas

HAVANA, March 25 .- Another terrible mistake, attended with loss of life and re-sulfing in many soldiers being womned, has taken place. In some manner unex-plained two columns of Spanish troops

opened the upon each other at midday.

According to the few details received here the columns of troops communiced by General Godoy and Colonel Heignin, at the Santa Rosa plantation, near Espanza. province of Santa Clera, mutually mis-took each other for insurgent forces, owing, it is said, to the thickness of the sugar cane. Each detachment opened fire upon the other, and for ten minutes shots were exchanged, resulting in the killing of seventeen soldiers, among them being Lientenant Colonel Fuenmayor, of the Navas battalion. In addition five officers and eighty-four soldiers were wounded. Two of the latter have since died, six others are mortally wounded and thirty-two are so-

Owing to the fact that the meeting between the two columns took place at mid-day the explanation furnished by the Spanish commanders is considered unsat-

isfactory, and court martial will follow.
Full details have now been received of
the burning by the insurgents of the
town of San Antonio de las Vegas, in
Pinar del Rio, the news of which was cabled to The Associated Press at the time

cabled to The Associated Press at the time of the occurrence.

On the night of Sunday, March 15, a numerous band of insurgents, under the leadership of Peter Diaz Castillo, invaded the handsome town of San Antonio de las Vegas with the twofold purpose of converting it to a heap of ashes and of compelling the Spanish garrison to surrender by burning and smoking them out. The first part of the plan succeeded, making panpers of thousands of industrious workingmen, whose families hastliy left their homes in the midst of the flames

left their homes in the midst of the flames and the fearful hissing of deadly bullets. seeking shelter in the wilderness and the woods. Mothers caught up their tender children in their feeblearms, sons dragged

their sick and aged fathers out of the fire to a distance from the town.

The second part of the plan for the cap-ture of the garrison failed, though it was frustrated only after a bitter struggle. The sentinel on watch gave the alarm when the insurgent forces first made their ap-pearance, and the officers and the garrison were promptly at their posts. A shower of bullets was thrown into the ranks of the invading enemy through loop holes and from behind parapets. But this did not prevent the spread of the fire in the town. It was already feeding upon the houses adjoining the fort when the com-mander, Captain Gonzalez, ordered the whole force of the garrison into the streets to demolish the houses which were supply-

ing food for the flames.

The attack by the insurgents lasted for two hours, when they were finally routed with heavy loss, their killed and wounded being carried off with them when they re-

As Reported by a Cuban Soldier. Boston, March 25.-The Standard publishes a letter from Captain C. S. B. Va-leros, the Cuban leader, in which he says: "We have marched and countermarched over 400 miles of territory the past two months and have met the enemy thirty-one different times, in twenty-eight of which we have been successful. The severest of these was on the railroad from Havana to Matanzas, in Havana province, about nine-teen miles from the capital, the battle of Morra del Rey. The enemy left twentynine killed and fifty-one wounded on the field, nine of whom were officers. General Gomez lost three killed and thirty-one wounded.

Disclaimed by the Spanish Government. WASHINGTON, March 25.-The Spanish government has officially disclaimed responsibility for the flery views expressed in the columns of the Madrid newspaper, El Epoca. The article which has called forth the disclaimer was one demanding that the United States cease talking about the Cuban insurrection or else declare war at once upon Spain, and the government felt that it might be harmful, because it was intimated that the article was in
