

The Body That of a Man Between Thirty and Thirty-five Years Old -Another Box Shipped to the Same Address Two

CHICAGO, March 28.—The police began Chicago, March 28.—The police began yesterday the attempt to unravel the invisery surrounding the body found in a box sold at a storage sale of unclaimed goods here on Thursday. The body, it has been learned, was shipped by 6. M. Morgan from Salt Lake City, Feb. 8, 1803, and consigned to binned at No. 106 Jefferson court, Chicago. The shipment was made over the Chicago and Northwestern railway. The locarrived in Chicago Feb. 16, 1803, and after lying unclaimed in the railway freight house for five months, was taken to the storage wavelennes of Walcom. taken to the storage warehouse of Wakem. & McLaughlin, on North Water street.

There is no such number at 106 Jefferson court. Mrs. Frederick A. Muclier keeps a lodging house in No. 16 Jefferson street. She said that two weeks ago an expressman said he had been to Jefferson avenue and Jefferson court, but could not find any trace of Morgan. Mrs. Muslier had never heard of him, and the express-man left. He had a box of some sort for Morgan. The police are now endeavoring to find this expressman.

The man whose body was found packed in the box was murdered. This was settled definitely yesterday afternoon when Dr. Louis J. Mitchell, coroner's physician, against he Dr. H. W. BECKE assisted by Dr. Hektoen, held a post mor-tem examination on the body at the county morgue. Two large holes had been made in the skull, and either would have killed the man. The weapon with which he was struck was some blunt instrument, as was shown by the size of the holes.

The post mortem proved that the body was that of a man five feet six inches high, weighing about 145 pounds. Judging from the bones the body was that of a man about 30 or 35 years of age. The teeth were all sound and all present. The hair on the head was medium long, straight and dark brown. There was no beard or moustache. The internal organs were all in a healthy condition. Around the body was a truss.

A singular circumstance is that the name G. M. Morgan belongs to one of the most efficient officers of the United States secret service. He has been in Sait Lake, and was quite well known there, being on intimate terms with the officials of the Mormon church. Still it is quite certain he was not in Sait Lake at the time of the shipment of the body, for he was in Chi-cago during the World's fair. Last winter Mr. Morgan was in Chicago,

and was at that time an invalid. He quite often ridiculed the idea that detectives were unravelers of mysteries, and one day said that he had often made failures, and said that he had often made failures, and the failures were at the times he was most sure of success. It may be that the shipment from Sait Lake was made by some one knowing him to be in Chicago at the time. Then there is a possibility that the name was chosen at random. At present none of his Chicago friends know of Mr. Morsen's when shows. Morgan's whereabouts. Whether he can help solve the mystery is doubtful.

Henry Devere and Bas Marcel appeared at the Armory police station last night and said they believed the body in the Wakem & McLaughlin box is that of Joanes Prosper Chaseal, who disappeared from Salt Lake City in February, 1893. They have seen the body and feel reason They have seen the body and feel reusonably certain it is that of Chaseal, Chaseal, supposed to be the man in the box, lived with a woman named Miss Rolande, on Franklin avenue, Salt Lake City, up to February, 1893, at what number the Frenchmen do not remember.

When the Box Was Shipped. SALT LAKE, March 28.—Investigation here has developed further facts relating to the box containing the corpse which was sold as unclaimed freight at the auction sale in Chicago on Thursday. The box was delivered to the Union Pacific freight office here on Feb 7, at 8 a. m. The man who paid the freight charges (\$17.55) signed his name as C. M. Morgan. He ok the train for Chicago on the same ate. He was a man of medium height, date. dark hair, moustache and beard, and wore a soft felt hat. The railway officials here remember that the man was excited and acted nervous while transacting his business at the depot.

Terribly Beaten by Women BERTRAND, Neb., March 28.-H. H. Wiley, a former justice of the peace, and a man with a large family, was charged with improper conduct toward the 7-year-old daughter of A. M. Hill, of Bertrand. A number of women, led by the mother of the girl, caught Willey and covered him with a revolver, and after tying his hands and placing a strap around his neck marched him out in front of the city hall and three women at a time thrashed him with blacksnake whips until his hands and face were dripping with blood. They were finally stopped by a constable, and Willey and his family left town.

Property Qualification for Delegates. GUTHRIE, O. T., March 28.—Everything indicates that the Republican territorial convention at Okiahoma City today will be exciting. Both the Reed and McKinley factions are claiming a majority. A move ment has been started by the taxpayers of the party for a resolution declaring that no delegate shall be elected who does not own real estate in the territory, and there will be a hard fight on this.

Cuban Resolutions Again Postponed. WASHINGTON, March 28.-Mr. Hitt, chair man of the foreign affairs committee, de-cided after consultation with Speaker Reed not to call up the conference report on the Cuban resolutions until the sundry civil appropriation bill had been passed. Mr. Cullon sought to table Mr. Hill's motion, but a motion to this effect failed by a vote of 21 to 20, where upon Mr. Cullom yielded to the Hill motion, and the New Mexico provision was stricked out. stricken out.

At the close of the day the senate passed the legislative bill, carrying \$21,500,000. Aside from providing the usual appropriations, the bill is important in effecting a reform of the system of compensation for 116 and 118 S. Main St. United States district attorneys and mar-shals, salaries being substituted for fees.

In the house the appropriations committee attempted to take up the sundry civil appropriation bill, but the members who were interested in bills on the private calendar defeated them by a vote of 142 to 77. The members of the appropriations committee do not view their defeat as the result of opposition to the appropriation bill. Members from the north, who are interested in pension legislation, and those from the south, who are interested in war claims, have been chaffing for some time over the inability to proceed with the work on the private calendar, and yester-day, by a sort of combination, the appro-

priations committee was defeated.
