Three Killed by a Falling Rock.

HINTON, W. Va., March 30.-Jim and Frank Tillman and Lucy Law were in-Frank Tillman and Lucy Law were instantly killed by a rock crashing through the house where they were sleeping at Echo, a station forty miles west of here, yesterday morning. Two other members of the family were seriously injured. The house was situated at the foot of the mountain on the banks of the New river. An enormous ledge of rock broke loose on the mountain side, passing over coke ovens and tearing up the track of the Chesa-peake and Ohio railroad and breaking through the house. Henry Law, one of the occupants who escaped, had the pres ence of men to rush out and flag an bound express train which would have otherwise been wrecked.

Futal Fire in a Hospital.

Lille, France, March 30.—A dangerous fire occurred yesterday in St. Saveuer church and hospital. All of the patients were rescued from the burning building, but three of them died subsequently from fright. Fifteen soldiers who were employed in quenching the fire went to a druggist's shop and there drank some pol-son which they mistook for gin. Six of them died as a result of the draught.

Nothing of a contraband character rewarded the searching party.

Burned to Death in Her Home. PITTSBURG, March 80.-Mrs. Essio Darhing was burned to death at her home, No. 5 Fort street, during the night. A live coal from the stove dropped on her dress. Her husband was sleeping in the same room, but her screams failed to awake him, and when the neighbors reached the place the woman was fatally burned, living but a few hours.



FATAL TENEMENT FIRE

It Results in Four Deaths and Seriour Lajurias to Two Others.

The burnest building is one of a row of three story structures owned by the Trimity durch corporation. The ground force

church corporation. The ground floor is occupied by John H. Eggers, a dealer in confectioners' supplies, and the upper floors were occupied by several families as dwellings. The second floor, immediately over the confectioners' quarters, was accupied for the most part by the family of Thomas McManus, consisting of Mr. and Mrs. McManus, two sons and two daughters. Twelve other rooms on that floor are used by the family of Mr. McManus, while three rooms in the rear portion of the floor wore occupied by a Mr. and Mrs. McMahon and the young man Malloy. who was boarding with thom,

who was boarding with them. On the third floor were a number of families. It was in the apartments of the McManus family that the fire originated, so far as the police and the firemen are able to determine. Nicholas McManus, one of the sons, who slept in one of the back rooms of the suits, was awakened by the smell of smoke. He turned in an alarm and awakened the tenants. It was apparent that the lives of many were in danand awaterial the tenants. It was apparent that the lives of many were in danger, for the smoke had permeated every part of the house and the flames were burning briskly. All of the McManus family were able to make their way down the stairs to the street before exit in that direction was cut off by the flames. It was among the tenants on the top floor that the chief danger lay. Some of them ran to the roof and escaped in that direction, but others sought to get down by the stairway. Miss Margaret Ryan and Miss Kate Higgins on being awakened ran to the front windows on the third floor, where they lived. The firemen had already arrived, and ladders had been placed on the front side of the house to help take out the tenants whose lives were

On one of these ladders was Fireman Walsh. As he was ascending a burst of flame and smoke shot out of one of the windows, and he was sent reeling to the street. As Walsh fell Miss Ryan leaped from the window to the sidewalk, and Miss Higgins, apparently partly overcome by the smoke in the rooms above, fell to the ground at almost the same time. An ambulance was sent for, but Miss Ryan was unconscious when placed in the conveyance, and died before the hospital was reached. Walsh was taken to the hospital at the same time. After the flames had been extinguished a search of the building was made, and the bodies of Thomas Malloy, Archibald Grogan and Mary McMahon were found.

Punishing the Matabeles.

BULUWAYO, Matabele, March 30.—Captain Gifford, leading a rescue force, left here on Thursday and succeeded in rescuing thirty-eight wnites who had gone into laager at Inseza. This was not effected larger at Inseza. This was not effected until after repelling an attack by a force of well armed Matabeles and inflicting upon them a heavy loss. The loss suffered by Gifford's force in the engagement was one killed and six wounded. Captain Spreckley, who repulsed a strong force of Matabeles on Thursday, inflicting a heavy loss upon them, has returned to Buluwayo bringing with him a large number of prisoners. He brings the disastrous intelligence that all the whites in the fill-bustering district have been massacred. The corpses were horribly mutilated and their faces burned almost beyond recognition.


