IMMIGRANTS QUARANTINED.

Eight People Bound for This Place Held at Philadelphia.

The Board of Health of town has received the following communication from Dr. Benjamin Lee, secretary of the State Board of Health:

"I transmit herewith a list of immigrants destined for your town who arrived at the port of Philadelphia on April 10th per S. S. Illinois, on board of which there was a case of varioloid. They have been held in the quarantine station of that port and no new cases have developed. It will, however, be for the interest of the public health that you should keep them under observation for an additional period of two weeks."

The names embraced in the list are: Ouzor Tysa, 639 Centre street; S. Blemanski, Vincenta Hurynowicz, 135 Main street; Anna Malczajska Antkocz, Gorycz Petrick, Simon Malczowicz, Franjicki Snywek. They have not arrived in town. Varioloid is small pox contracted by a person who has been vaccinated and the disease does not develop as strong, or last as long as in a person who has not been vaccinated.

Fatal Contagious Cases.

Paluda Kivalig, the 4-year-old child, residing at 220 West Poplar street, reported on the 9th inst. as suffering from scarlet fever, died on Saturday and was buried in the Polish cemetery.

George Jeffrey, 14-month-old child, died of scarlet fever on Saturday at the residence of Mrs. Glock, at 39 South Bowers street. The mother of the child resides at Ashland and when the illness developed was visiting Mrs. Glock, who is her sister. The latter was the first case of death from scarlet fever in this town during the past 18 months.

Katie Ullman, 6 years old, died from diphtheria at Wm. Penn on Friday and was buried in the Lithuanian cemetery of this place on Saturday.

Scrapped in Fourteen.

The police made three raids in the southern part of town between 11 and 12 o'clock last night and scrapped in 14 men on charges of drunkenness and nuisance and indecent exposure. Six were arrested in a house on South Main street, five in a house on "the rocks" and three on the vacant lot at the junction of Main street and the railroad. The men arrested in the houses were playing violins and accordions, dancing, singing and creating a general nuisance. All paid the borough fine and costs to the Chief Burgess this morning and were discharged.

A man is forced to buy in the company store if married and if single pays \$22 per month for board.

Wreck on the Reading Road.

A southbound freight train on the P. & E. railroad was wrecked opposite the Keystone breaker, at Locust Dale, Saturday afternoon, and three young men of a party of eight who were stealing a ride were injured very badly, one of them probably fatally. Their names are James Sweeney, aged 17 years, of Shamokin; Charles Hester, aged 20, Mahanoy City; and John Gillopie, aged 19, Shamokin. They were removed to the Mineders' hospital. The wreck was caused by a broken axle on the forward truck of one of four cars of lumber, on the top of which three young men were riding. The train was a long one of forty cars of mixed freight. Only six of them left the mile, and of these three were wrecked quite badly, and both tracks were blocked. The train was running under control at the time and did not go more than a hundred yards when the axle broke.
