I do not know whother we hit any of them or not. We sent word to town for rein-forcements, but when the boys came the regulators were ont of sight.

It is now stated positively that one regu-inter-Aliez Reed-was killed and another mortally wounded in the skirmish at Durlo's.

Armed squads are on duty at every road entering the town and the court house is an arsonal. The Washington Louisiana an arsonal. The Washington Louisiana boys, thirty strong, who came down to fight with the citizens against the regula-tors, have hurried home. A courier brings the news that Washington is being surrounded and that the regulators are creat-ing consternation among the inhabitants of Bellaire Cave.

It is believed now that the regulators will not come into town today. There are 150 armed men waiting for them. The dis-trict attorney has sent in word that his regulators will enter town today, and that he has twenty Winchesters at his back to



Died in His Own "Health Chamber." BALTIMORE, April 21.-Dr. Charles H. Palmer, who has been living alone in a house on East Eager street for some years, was found dead by neighbors yesterday. The doctor, who was 60 years old, had been an ardent believer in the sweat-box system for the preservation of health. He had constructed an upright, collin-shaped box of the kind, in which he was in the habit of spending hours at a time. The box was fitted with an apparatus which fur-nished the equivalent of a turkish bath. He is supposed to have been in the box more than thirty-six hours when found dead and his corpse upright.


