

Then, amid profound silence, the judge sentenced, individually and sepa-rately, Lionel Phillips, George Farrar, Colonel Francis Rhodes and John Hays Hammond to death and in the foregoing order. The prisoners were perfectly calm and merely bowed to the judge when their

The judge then sentenced the other prisoners to pay fines of \$10,000 each, to undergo two years' imprisonment, and to three years' banishment, although the latter punishment is made subject to the will of the executive.

The schences pronounced caused con-sternation among all classes here, and it was the general opinion that counsel for the defense made a great mistake in not introducing evidence by which the accused would be tried in proportion to their re-spective offenses, instead of placing them all upon the same footing. The judge did not give weight to the plan that the pris-oners were more guilty of folly than of erime. \*

Fully forty of them avow that they could have proved their entire innocept in joining the movement late in the day and in signing the manifesto. 



#### Imprisoned in Morro Castle.

Kry WEST, Fla., April 30.—The schooner Competitor, which was captured by the Spanish gunboat Mensagera, shipped out from here about 13 o'clock on the night of the 21st. The steamer Muscotte arrived from Havana last night. Just before she left Havana in the afternoon a gunboat came in with sixteen Americans and seven Cubans, one woman and one child, all in chains, and they were placed in Morro Castle. Soon afterward another Morro Castle. Soon afterward another gunboat towed in the Competitor. The prisoners, it is believed here, will be shot.

#### Indiana Miners on Strike.

INDIANPOLIS, April 30 .- The action of the Indiana bituminous coal operators in reducing the wages schedule from sixty to thirty-five cents hore fruit yesterday in a strike of the miners at various points in the coal belt. The officers of the Island company, which has headquarters in this city, roceived word by telegraph that all of their miners, 400 in number, struck yes-terday morning. The miners are confi-dent that all of the miners in the state, fully 4,000, will quit work, and that all the mines will close down.

#### Religious Liberty for Russia.

LONDON, April 30.—The Rome corre-spondent of The Daily News telegraphs that the Vatican officials have learned that on the occasion of the coronation of the czar a proclamation will be issued granting liberty of conscience throughout the dominions of Russia. The holy synod, it is added, is vehemently trying to prevent the issue of the proclamation.

Steamer Sunk, Two Handred Drowned. SHANGHAL, April 50. -A collision oc-curred at Woo Sung this morning be-tween the steamers New Chwang and On Wo. The latter sank and over 200 persons, mostly Chinese, were drowned.



#### Lawyer Howe Acquitted.


