LOYAL TO THE PREMIER

The French Chamber of Deputies Votes Confidence in M. Meline.

THE PREMIER'S PACIFIC POLICY.

The Government Ready to Acknowledge the Right of Universal Suffrage and the Radicals and Socialists Will Push That Policy—Chamber Adjourns to May 26.

PARIS, May 1.—At the opening of the chamber of deputies yesterday M. Meline, the new premier, read a statement in which the government recognizes the preponderance of the chamber of deputies, but affirms that it is impossible to govern without the senate. M. Meline said that the government desired to pursue a pacific policy and appeal to the good will of the Republican majority for a settlement of urgent questions, as the best means of preventing the spread of revolutionary doctrines.

Continuing, the premier said that the government would not fall in its duty to enforce respect for the laws and maintain order. M. Meline concluded with adjuring parliament not to raise irritating questions, in the interest of France, which, he asserted, thrived for peace and tranquility.

In anticipation of the announcement of the ministerial program the galleries of the chamber of deputies were crowded, and there was a full attendance of members. Premier Meline's statement was greeted with applause by the Conservatives, particularly in its denunciation of the Socialists.

M. Goblet maintained that the cabinet had been chosen from outside of the Republican-Progressive majority. In the formation of a cabinet, he added, the chamber of deputies and not the senate should have been consulted. He expressed the hope that the deputies would vote against the government.

M. Paul Deschanel spoke, urgently advocating revision of the constitution.

M. Meline replied that it was impossible for the ministry to discuss the question of revision at this time, but that the matter would come before the chamber of deputies in due season. The premier then asked the chamber for a vote of confidence. He declared that harmony between the chamber of deputies and the senate is necessary to the proper conduct of the government. At the same time, he added, the government is ready to acknowledge the right of universal suffrage. The government's program, M. Meline said, was based upon the known wishes of the country.

M. Bourgeois, premier of the late cabinet, asked M. Meline if the direction of the country's policy belonged to the chamber of deputies or to the senate. The recent attitude of the last named body, M. Bourgeois said, was in the nature of an attempt to seize the direction of policy. The chamber of deputies, M. Bourgeois asserted, should uphold its vote of April 23, affirming the preponderance of the representatives of universal suffrage and the chamber's determination to pursue a policy of democratic reform. M. Bourgeois concluded by saying:

"We stand ready for a dissolution of parliament and for revision of the constitution. It is the duty of the national assembly to define the powers of the chamber of deputies and of the senate."

M. Meline asked why it was that M. Bourgeois demanded that the present government undertake the revision of the constitution when he had avoided that task himself. The government, he said, would repudiate the policy as tending to dangerous agitation.

M. Ricard, minister of justice in the late cabinet, reintroduced his motion of April 23, to which M. Bourgeois had just alluded, and demanded urgency for it, which, on demand of Meline, was rejected by a vote of 279 to 251.

Premier Meline then accepted a motion affirming the preponderance of universal suffrage, and approving the government's statement. The first part of the motion was adopted by a unanimous vote. The second part was adopted by a vote of 231 to 190. The motion as a whole was then adopted, the vote standing 293 to 259.

The chamber then adjourned until May 26.

The Radical and Socialist minority met after the sitting of the chambers and decided upon an active campaign against the senate and in favor of universal suffrage in every commune in the country.

NEW YORK, May 1.—Theodosia Schumacher, a stenographer, 19 years of age, was killed while taking a bicycle ride by being run over by a truck belonging to the Krumenacker Bottling company, driven by Albert Kentz. The driver of the wagon has been placed under arrest.

Over Three Hundred Were Drowned.

SHANGHAI, May 1.—It is now ascertained that 300 Chinese and five English people, including the captain, were drowned by the sinking of the steamer On Wo in collision with the New Changang at Woo Sung.

Hirsch's Bequest to Wales.

LONDON, May 1.—A new London paper, The Daily Courier, publishes the statement that the late Baron de Hirsch bequeathed \$5,000,000 to the Prince of Wales.

FIVE YEARS IN PRISON.

The Reported Punishment for the Transvaal "Reformers."

THE EVIDENCE AGAINST THEM.

It Proved That Not Only Premier Rhodes, but Officials of Chartered South African Company Knew of the Plot to Invade the Transvaal.

PRITORIA, May 1.—The excitement caused by the sentences imposed upon the reformers. What influence this will have upon President Kruger and his advisers is not known. It is currently reported, however, that the executive council had decided to substitute for the death penalty sentences of five years' penal servitude, and, at the expiration of that time, banishment for life.

Mr. Hammond, it seems to be clearly established, played an active part in the preparations for the Transvaal raid. He was the confidential employe and friend of Cecil Rhodes. In one case, for instance, it is shown that Hammond was instructed by Dr. Jameson to "inform weak persons" that "any delay would be injurious."

Further telegrams submitted in evidence show that Dr. Jameson was urgently instructed to start the raid at midnight on Saturday, Dec. 28, and was enjoined to "keep the telegraph silent," as it was suspected that the Transvaal was "getting wind" of the affair. Other telegrams showed that the British Chartered South Africa company was the actual authority for the raid. They refer to getting arms and ammunition from the De Beers mines, where they had been secretly stored.

At the last moment, however, a hitch seems to have occurred, and dispatches were sent to Dr. Jameson telling him to "postpone the operation" owing to the difficulties experienced in getting Cecil Rhodes absolutely to pledge that the authority of the imperial government need not be insisted upon in order to cross the border. Hammond, evidently, was among those who were opposed to any breach of the law, for a telegram from him was produced, dated Dec. 27, in which he condemned any further developments of the contemplated movement.

Subsequent dispatches exchanged between the various persons interested in the raid indicate that Jameson cut the telegraph wires so as not to receive any further messages against the scheme; that President Kruger really had knowledge of the affair, and succeeded in intercepting the messages, or that Jameson willfully disregarded the instructions sent him to postpone the raid, and crossed the border on his own responsibility. Previous to crossing the border the raiders had been drilled by the Lee-Metford rifle, the weapon adopted by the Chartered company, and preparations had been made to support the raiders with other forces from Cape Colony, but the hasty action of Dr. Jameson upset the plans. Additional testimony showed that on Dec. 28 the Uitlanders of Johannesburg were arming and making other preparations to receive Dr. Jameson, all steps being taken under the direction of the reform committee.

Colonel Rhodes, at the Gold Fields company's office, on Dec. 28, utterly told a representative of the Boers who called upon him for an explanation as to what was going on, that they, the Uitlanders, had brought the country into a flourishing condition by means of their capital and enterprise, and that it was "hard to be governed by a lot of stupid Boers." When the colonel was asked why the Uitlanders wished to be protected against, he replied: "The lower classes." When it was pointed out to him that the reform committee was arming the very classes the Uitlanders claimed they wished to be protected against, he made no reply.

A SENSATION IN ENGLAND.

The British Press Generally Condemns the "Reformers" Attitude.

LONDON, May 1.—It would be difficult to over estimate the sensation which has been caused in England by the publication of the substance of the telegrams and documents which have come into the possession of the authorities of the South African republic. The weight of evidence which they furnish of a conspiracy to overthrow the Transvaal is admitted to be crushing. The opinion of the press very generally condemns them. But strenuous efforts are made to prevent a sweeping condemnation of the authorities of Cape Colony and of the British Chartered South Africa company, other than the individuals whose names are included in the documentary evidence.

The Times, in an editorial on the subject, says: "It is impossible to ignore the gravity of the conclusion to which the published telegrams point. They establish beyond the possibility of a doubt that Hon. Cecil Rhodes, the then premier of Cape Colony; Mr. Alfred Beit, a director in the British South Africa company, and Mr. Rutherford Harris, secretary of the British South Africa company, were privy to the movement against Johannesburg, and that the leaders of the movement counted upon their help and countenance to insure its success."

"The telegrams must be taken to prove that Mr. Rhodes approved the revolution which was desired in Johannesburg, but nothing in the correspondence goes to show that the actual crossing of the frontier by Dr. Jameson under the circumstances under which it eventually occurred was known to Mr. Rhodes or carried out with his approval."
