ALL QUIET IN PERSIA. The Shah's Elder Brother Gives Assurance of His Loyalty.

MANY CONSPIRATORS ARRESTED.

The Assassin of the Late Shah Declares That He Is the Emissary of Well Known Perslans-It Was Intended to Murder the Grand Vizler Also.

TEHERAN, Persia, May 4.--Muzaffer-Ed-Dine Mirga, second son of the inte shah, was enthroned on Saturday morning at Tabriz with the title of shah in shah(king of kings). The body of Nazz Ed-Dine, the murdered shah, has been embalmed and will be taken to Koom for interment after the arrival of the new shah. Owing to the prompt and energetic action of the grand prompt and energetic action of the grand vizer perfect order reigns everywhere. All the princes, governors, ministers and of-ficials have telegraphed their congratula-tions to Muzaffer-Ed-Dine on the succes-sion, whose replies have been very grac-lous, and especially to his oldest brother, Zil Es Sultan, of whose acquiescence in his younger brother's accession some doubts have been expressed. Mozaffer Ed-Dine has confirmed the present grand vizier, the Sadr Azam, with

full powers. Many arrests have been made in connection with the assassination of the shah. The murderer states that he is an emissary of Jem Aleddin and other well known Persians. It was intended to murder both the shah and the grand vizier. The news of the murder led to disorders

and the looting of bazars at Shiras. The governor took prompt measures to pay ar-rears of salary to the troops and to assure the people. The shah has confirmed his eldest brother

(Zii-E=Sultan) as governor of Ispahan. The latter has given assurances of his loyalty to the public security. The shah has postponed his journey to Teheran for a

LONDON, May 4 .- A Constantinople dis patch to The Times says that the nurder of the shah has thrown the sultan into a state of extreme horror. Foreigh tele-grams are excluded, and the local papers are forhidden to refer to the subject.

### Importing Negroes and Italians to Supplant the Strikers.


MILWAUKER, May 4.—A strike of all electric railway and electrical lighting workers in the city has been declared. The company has rejected the demands of the men, and Italians and negroes to man the cars and lighting plants are arriving from Charges. The motorman who has from Chicago. The motorman who han-died the car conveying the new men to the East Side barns deserted his car.

The company employs over 900 men, and as each car was run into barns last night both motorman and conductor left it, not to return until the demands of the union for increased pay, recognition of the employes' organization and several minor oncessions are granted.

Cooks arrived from Chicago last night and were at once taken to the car barns, where arrangements had been made to feed the new men, who will sleep in the barns as long as they are in any danger of violence. Similar arrangements have been made at the power house on River street. Special policemen were sworn in today, some of whom are stationed at the barns and power houses, and others will be placed on the cars to protect the new men. Thus far the tle up is complete.



WILLIAM HONORS UHL Our New Ambassador to Germany Formally Received WITH POHP AND GIROUMSTANCE. The Monarch and the Diplomat Vie with Each Other In Expressions of Reartiest Friendship and Admiration for the Two Governments.

BERLIN, May 4.—Yesterday was set for the first and/ence by the emperor to Mr. Edwin F. Uhl, the new United States am-bassador appointed upon the death of Mr. Theodore Runyon, the late ambassador. The audience was given in a driving rain storm, but the ceremony was otherwise an unqualified success.

At 8 o'clock promptly Baron Usedom, court chamberlain, whose function it is to could characterian, whose function is sto-introduce diplomats to the sovereign, called at Mr. Uhl's temporary home with three gorgeous court equipages. In the first of these rode Mr. J. B. Jackson, first secretary of the United States embassy, secretary of the United States embassy, bearing the letter of credence for the new ambassador. Mr. Jackson has acted as charge in the interval before Mr. Uhl's ar-rival. In the second carriage rode Mr. Uhl blinself and Baron Usedom, preceded by two outriders bearing the white and red Brandenburg colors, their uniforms being trimmed with heavy silver embroid-ery. All of the officials wore elaborate uniforms, and numerous lackeys were in attendance in livery. The horses were gally caparisoned.

The third carriage was occupied by the suite of the embassy, including Mr. H. G. Squiers, the second secretary of the em-bassy, and Lieutenant Robert K. Evans, the military attache, the latter clad in handsome regimentals. While driving up Unter den Linden the

military guards marched up to the car-riages and presented arms to the roll of the

drums. There were large crowds in the street to witness the pageant. Arrived at the schloss Baron Usedom Usbered Mr. Uhl into the white salon. Only Baron Marchall von Bieberstein, the imperial minister of foreign affairs, was present besides the emperor and Mr. Uhi. At the conclusion of an audience of tweive minutes Mr. Jackson and the suite of the embassy were admitted and shook hands with the emperor, who conversed pleasantly for a few minutes with all of them. He then led the way to a smaller


Mr. Uhl was thereupon summoned to an adjoining salon, where the empress and the ladles of the court waited. Haron von Mirbach, as the conress! court marshal, introduced Mr. Uhl. The empress con-versed affabiy with Mr. Uhl for a few minutes and next received and conversed with the suite of the embassy.

Altogether thirty-flye minutes were con-sumed within the schloss. Then in the same carriages, and with the same elabo-orate ceremony, the members of the as-sembly returned to the kaiserhof.

A representative of the Associated Press had an interview with Mr. Uhl after the audience. He said that his audience had been a very pleasant one and he was very well satisfied with the results, but he dewell satisfied with the results, but he de-clined to divulge the subject of the re-marks which had been made on either side. The Associated Press, however, learned elsewhere that Mr. Uhl's speech, which had been prepared in advance and the copy submitted to the court officials, ac-cording to the custom and requirements, pointed out to the emparor the important and close relations existing between the two countries, both in commerce and and close thatoms closed in commerce and science. Many of the best oltizons of the United States, he sold, were of German birth and descent. He expressed the hope that these ties would strengthen, and not disturb the peaceful and friendly relations of the two countries, and concluded with an expression of his admiration of the

ountry to which he was accredited and for its ruler.

for its ruler. The emperor replied briefly to Mr. Uhl in English, joining in the hope which the latter had expressed, and spoaking very appreciatively and admiringly of the United States and of Americans. He trusted, he said, that Mr. Uhl's activity would redound to the better understand-



### He Robbed the Poor.

PITTSBURG, May 4.-Lorin Chambers, who is charged with being instrumental in swindling thousands of people in Pitts-burg and Philadelphia within the past few years, is in a cell at the county jail. His arrest ends a long chase. Lorin Cham-bers is the oldest son of a good old Phila-delphia family. In the summer of 1994 Chambers came to Pittaburg, accompanied by his brother, W. D. Chambers, and R. H. Black and N. H. Miller. They opened an office on Fourth avenue under the name of the Commercial Loan and Trust com-pany. The plan of this institution was the sale of bonds, the par value of which was alleged to be \$500, to poor people. The scheme was new then, and hundreds of people invested. Subsequently the quar-tette disappeared without redeeming any of the bonds.

#### Shot by a Jealous Hushand,

IRONTON, O., May 4.-James Beals, a stove molder, shot and fatally wounded his wife yesterday. The couple had been out walking, and immediately upon their return home Boals drew a revolver and gred four shots at his wife, three of them taking effect. The dead was actuated by jeatonsy. Beals escaped, but is closely pursued by officers.
