



# It In Now Believed That About Twenty Perished.

THE WORE OF RESCUE RETARDED.

CINCINNATT'S HORROR.

The Men Who Were Digging in the Rulus Forced to Guit Work for Fear of a Furthey Collapse-Bracing Up the Totlering Walls,

CONCENSATI, May 6.-The hurbit alive of well known people has caused general dis-tress here. After the explosion of Monday night that demolished the five story buildnight that demolished the five story build-ings occupied by Adolph Drach and Louis Foy on the first floors, and with flats on the four upper floors, relays of workmen-centinued removing the debris till almost noon yesterday, when everybody was or-dered from the premises, and Walnut street between Fourth and Fifth streets was kept clear. Holes had been made in the walls of adjoining buildings through which to extricate victims. The great mass of debris supported these walls, and its removal caused the adjacent walls to builge out so that a still greater calamity has been momentarily expected from both aides of the wreekage. When the street cleaning force and fire-men were ordered away it was bolleved that there were several persons still in the orderes, and some of them alive, but the engineers agreed with the building in-floorth that leas the debrief in the building in-

engineers, and some of them alive, but the engineers agreed with the building in-spector that loss of life to the workmen was inevitable if they presended. Brases were put up against the walls and scaf-folds quickly constructed. The work of tearing down adjacent walls is progress-ing with all possible speed. Meanthine those still in the debris had to be left to their fate, and no more are likely to be taken out allye. There have been eight dead being seed. dead bodies recovered, two are in sight and ten are still missing.

and ion are still missing. There were many more included in the list of these missing yesterday, but those who are still missing are generally be-lieved to be in the ruins. The names of all missing persons have been so generally published that those not belonging in that list promptly reported to police headquar-ters. Inquiries have been made at the residences of those who are still missing readences of those who are still missing today, and there has been nothing seen or known of them. All of the injured perknown of them. All of the injured per-sons are doing well-at the hospital. John McCarthy died at the hospital last night from internal injuries. He begred his brother and the firemen to kill him Monday night, when he was first found in the debris, and he suffered intensely until his death

One of the most prominent victims of the disaster is C. F. Andress, president of the Andress Mears Wall Paper company. He was seen to enter Drach's saloon on his way home just before the explosion of the high it was at first thought he had scaped. The workmen had reached his body when they were called out, but they assortained that he was dead and that it was impossible to he was dead and that it was impossible to extricate the body without endangering their own lives. Andress was slitting in a chair at a table drinking a glass of beer and reading a paper when the explosion occurred. This is clearly proven by the present position of his body which is hold fast in the timber. The body of Mamie Kennedy was also found by the workman in the debris, but it could not be brought out and none of the bodies remaining in the wreckage can be recovered until the danger from the surrounding walls is first removed.

It was at first supposed that Mrs. Drach was among the duad, but when she was reached by reseners yesterday she was still alive, but suffering terribly. She was pin-bond for hours with a baby in her arms, she had been in sight for over two hours, and stimulants and water were passed down at intervals. The baby was lying on her breast apparently uninjured, while abeton. The falling timbers had crushed out Miss Singleton's life, but her body protected Mrs. Drach from death.
