BOND INVESTIGATION.

The Senate Passes the Amended Peffer Resolutions

WITH BUT SIX DISSENTING VOTES.

The Work Delegated to the Senate Finance Committee, and the Instructions Are for a Thorough Inquiry Into All Recent Hond Transactions.

Washington, May 8.—By 'he decleive vote of 51 to 5 the senate yesterday inaugurated an investigation to be conducted by the senate committee on finance into by the senate committee on finance into the facts and circumstances connected with the sale of United States bonds by the secretary of the treasury during the last three years. The six adverse votes were cast by Sonators Caffery, Faulkner, Gray, Hill, Mitchell and Palmer, all Dem-cerats. The resolution directing the in-vestigation is very explicit, as follows: Resolved, That the committee on finance be directed first: To investigate and re-port generally all the material facts and

port generally all the material facts and circumstances connected with the sale of United States bonds by the secretary of the treasury in the years 1894, 1895 and

"Second: To investigate and report specially what amount of available funds, classified, was in the United States troasury and on deposit in other places, subject to the order of the secretary of the treasury at the time the bonds were sold or offered for sale; whether there was or was not coin enough on hand to meet all coin ob-ligation of the government due at the time said bonds were sold or when they were offered for sale; what obligations were due at the time and the amount of each, stated separately; what was the reason for any unusual withdrawal of coin from the treasury shortly before bonds were sold or offered for sale, if such unusual withdrawals were in fact made, and by what per-sons or classes of persons and for what purpose or on what account such with-drawals were made; who purchased the bonds, in what amounts and where, whether in the United States or in foreign countries, and in what proportions and countries, and in what proportions are from what persons or classes of persons the gold was procured with which to pay for the bonds; what the bonds sold for, and what was the market price of our government bonds at the time, and what effect the bonds sales had on the credit and business of the people of the United States.

"Third: To investigate and report as to the manner of disposing of said bonds, by what authority and what contracts, ad vertisements or proposals were made by the secretary of the treasury in relation thereto; what agreements or contracts, and whether oral or in writing, and whether publicly or privately, were en-tered into by the secretary of the treasury and any syndicate or person or persons with respect to the sale and purchase of the bonds, and the profits made or to be made by such syndicate, or any person or persons connected with the syndicate, directly or indirectly; whether such agree-ment had any and what effect on the prices offered for the bonds, what the effect was, and who, if any person, profited by it, and to what extent."

HAIR CUTTING A SPECIALTY.

THE HANGING OF HOLMES

The Notorious Criminal Met His Death Fearlessly.

DIED PROTESTING HIS INNOCENCE.

Just Before Plunging Into Eternity He Declared He Had No Hand in the Killing of Benjamin F. Pitezel or Any of the Pitezel Family.

Philadelenia, May 8.—Herman, W. Mudgett, alias H. H. Holmes, was hanged in Moyamensing prison shortly after 10 o'clock yesterday morning. It was fully a half-hour later before he was officially pronounced dead. A half-minute before he was shot into electricy he made this designation to the soleum assemblings. declaration to the solemn assumblage

gathered about the scaffold:
"Gentlemen, I have very few words to In fact I would make no remarks at this time except that by not speaking I would appear to acquiesce in my execu-tion. I only wish to say that the extent of my wrong doing in taking human life consisted in the death of two women, they having died at my hands as the result of having died at my hands as the result of criminal operations. I wish to also state here, so that there can be no chance of misunderstanding hereafter, that I am not guilty of taking the lives of any of the Pitezel family—the three children and Benjamin, the father, of whose death I was convicted and for which I am today to be hanged. That is all I have to say." (The two women referred to are Mrs. Gor-(The two women referred to are Mrs. Ger-trude Connor and Miss Emily Cigrand).

It will be seen that the words are well chosen. They were equally well pro-nounced. The voice never quavered, and the hands clasped on the dark railing of the scaffold did not tremble. The nerve which had all along characterized this most marvellous of assassins had not deserted him to the very end. As the last serted him to the very end. As the last syllable fell from his pallid lips he turned to his attorney. Clasping the shaking right hand of the young lawyer in his his own grasp—firm even at that terrible moment—he laid his left on the other man's shoulder, and, gazing straight into his eyes, uttered in a loud voice, "Good-by." Then he carefully buttoned his coat, nodded to the sheriff, and an instant later shot to his death.

He was undoubtedly the most stelld of any in that assemblage of fifty odd men. The pallor of his face was no deeper than the ordinary prison bleach, and he stood erect, gazing steadfastly before him, until the horrible black cap shut out his last look at earthly things.

look at earthly things.

He spent his last day of life uneventfully. During part of Wednesday Father Daily, of the Church of the Annanciation, visited him and said prayers. In the afternoon his lawyer, Samuel P. Rotan, called for a short time. The balance of the day Holmes occupied reading his Bible and other devotional backs. Father Daily, care other devotional books. Father Daily came again early in the evening and remained until 10:15 o'clock.

After the priess left Holmes wrote letters of farowell until midnight. It is understood that these communications were addressed to his wives—the one in Gilmanton, N. H., and Georgianna Yoke, of Franklin, Ind., the third wife, whose tes-timony did so much to bring about his execution. He also penned a letter of in-structions to Mr. Rotan, his counsel. Absolute secreey is maintained regarding the contents of these letters.

At midnight he undressed and went to bed, under the watchful eye of Keeper George Wenver, who was fearful lest the man in the cell beyond might commit sui-cide. But, apparently, nothing was fur-ther from the abnormal mind of his charge. Holmes slept the sleep of an innocent babe, and at 6 o'clock in the morning it

At 7 o'clock Father Daily came, with Father McPake, of the same church. Holmes received them silently, and knelt with them while they went over the communion service. According to the rites of the Catholic church, to which be had been converted during the past week—in form, at least—he had been fasting since minight. The service once over, his breast fast of eggs, dry toast and coffee was brought in and he fell to with aid apparent relish.

The only sign of defiance he made just after the priests left.

"Am I nervous?" he demanded, stretching his hands out to Keeper Weaver, They were steady as a rock. Holmes smiled and retired to the rear of his cell, declaring that he had never in his life folt better than he then did. was approached by a flight of steps.

The witnesses passed around the atructure and faced it. An awful silence followed for a moment. Then a murmur of sound arose from the other side of the scaffold. It was the prayers of the priests, who were escenting Holmes to the gallows. A moment later they mounted the steps and came into view. Holmes, a cru-cifix clasped in both hands, upon which his eyes were fixed, walked steadily be-

There was a pause after they had reached the deadly trap, and then Holmes stepped forward and pronounced his valedictory. It took him exactly two minutes to pro-nounce what nearly every man there regurded as the last of ascries of lies. Father Dully is the only man who knows whether or not the man went into eternity with a lie on his lips, for to him Holmes, either Wednesday night or yesterday, made a final confession. But that is buried in the

sourcets of the church.

After shaking hands with his lawyer,
who then left the scaffold, Holmes turned
and hade facewell to Superintendents Perkins and Richardson and the pricets, Then he and the two clorgymen knelt in silent prayer. They arose at 10:12 o'clock. In another half minute the end had come. The execution was entirely successful.

After the body had been cut down it was placed in a plain pine box, the bottom and sides of which were covered with coment. This was done so that the material will harden about the corpse and practically fasten it to the box, preventing any attempt to steal the body. The body was taken to Mount Moriah cemetery and placed in a vault, which was guarded all night. Thence it will be taken in a few days and buried in another cemetery pri-


